AN ACT

- Establishing the Pennsylvania SBIR/STTR Matching Funds Program to provide technology grants to small businesses.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 7 Small Business Innovation Grant and Small Business Technology
- 8 Transfer Matching Funds Program Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Business." A for-profit business that is headquartered in
- 14 this Commonwealth and participates in either the Federal SBIR or
- 15 STTR program.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic

- 1 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 2 "SBIR." The Federal Small Business Innovation Research
- 3 Program created under 15 U.S.C. § 638 (relating to research and
- 4 development).
- 5 "STTR." Small Business Technology Transfer Program created
- 6 under 15 U.S.C. § 638.
- 7 "Program." The Pennsylvania SBIR/STTR Matching Funds Program
- 8 established under section 3.
- 9 Section 3. Establishment and purpose of program.
- 10 The Pennsylvania SBIR/STTR Matching Funds Program is
- 11 established and shall be administered by the department. The
- 12 department may provide a grant to an eligible business in an
- 13 amount that matches money received under an SBIR or STTR Phase I
- 14 award from the Small Business Administration. The department
- 15 shall encourage business participation for Phase II awards.
- 16 Section 4. Eligibility.
- 17 To be eligible for a grant under this act, a business must:
- 18 (1) Have at least one of the business's principal places
- of business located in this Commonwealth.
- 20 (2) Have received a SBIR or STTR Phase I award from the
- 21 Small Business Administration in response to a specific
- 22 Federal solicitation. To receive a full grant award, the
- 23 business must have submitted a final Phase I report,
- 24 demonstrated that the Small Business Administration has
- interest in the Phase II project proposal and submitted a
- 26 Phase II project proposal to the Small Business
- 27 Administration.
- 28 (3) Satisfy Federal SBIR or STTR requirements.
- 29 (4) Have not received nor shall receive concurrent
- 30 funding support from other sources that duplicates the

- 1 purpose of this act.
- 2 (5) Certify that at least 51% of the research described
- 3 in the Federal SBIR or STTR Phase II project proposal will be
- 4 conducted in this Commonwealth and that the business will
- 5 remain based in this Commonwealth for the duration of the
- 6 SBIR or STTR Phase II project.
- 7 (6) Demonstrate the business's ability to conduct
- 8 research in the SBIR or STTR Phase II project proposal.
- 9 Section 5. Grant awards.
- 10 (a) Grant. -- The department may award a grant to match the
- 11 money received by a business through an SBIR or STTR Phase I
- 12 proposal up to a maximum of \$50,000. Seventy-five percent of the
- 13 total grant shall be remitted to the business upon receipt of
- 14 the SBIR or STTR Phase I award. Twenty-five percent of the total
- 15 grant award shall be remitted to the business upon submission of
- 16 the Phase II application to the Small Business Administration by
- 17 the business and acceptance of the Phase I report by the Small
- 18 Business Administration.
- 19 (b) Limitations.--A business may:
- 20 (1) Receive only one grant per year.
- 21 (2) Receive only one grant under this act with respect
- 22 to each Federal proposal submission.
- 23 (3) Only receive a maximum of five awards under the
- 24 program.
- 25 Section 6. Application.
- The department shall develop an application process for the
- 27 program and publish the application process on the department's
- 28 publicly accessible Internet website. The application shall
- 29 include:
- 30 (1) The name of the business.

- 1 (2) The form of business organization under which the
- business operates.
- 3 (3) The name or address of the principal or management
- 4 of the business.
- 5 (4) The Small Business Administration's acknowledgment
- of receipt of the Phase I report and Phase II proposal.
- 7 (5) Any additional information the department deems
- 8 necessary to evaluate the application.
- 9 Section 7. Funding.
- 10 The General Assembly shall appropriate money to the
- 11 department for the administration and distribution of grants
- 12 under this act.
- 13 Section 8. Regulations.
- 14 The department may promulgate regulations as necessary to
- 15 implement the program.
- 16 Section 9. Effective date.
- 17 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
