AN ACT

1 Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania  
2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for use of government  
3 property.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
5 hereby enacts as follows:

17 § 2101. Definitions.

18 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

19 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

1 context clearly indicates otherwise:

2 "Political subdivision." A county, city, borough,  
3 incorporated town, township, school district or vocational  
4 school or county institution district and an authority, entity  
5 or body organized by a county, city, borough, incorporated town,  
6 township, school district or vocational school or county  
7 institution district.

8 "Public employee." An individual employed by the  
9 Commonwealth or a political subdivision.

10 "Public official." A person elected by the public or elected  
11 or appointed by a governmental body or an appointed official in  
12 the executive, legislative or judicial branch of this  
13 Commonwealth or a political subdivision thereof.

14 § 2102. Proof of valid driver's license required.

15 A public official or public employee who operates a  
16 government vehicle shall annually provide proof to the  
17 respective governmental body or employer responsible for the  
18 vehicle that the public official or public employee holds a  
19 valid driver's license under the provisions of 75 Pa.C.S. Ch. 15  
20 (relating to licensing of drivers).

21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
