7	Section 1. Section 8103 of Title 35 of the Pennsylvania				
8	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions to read:				
9	§ 8103. Definitions.				
10	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter				
11	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the				
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:

14	"Qualified applicant." An emergency medical services agency				
15	which provides advanced emergency medical services under section				
16	8130 (relating to advanced life support ambulances), basic				
17	emergency medical services under section 8133 (relating to basic				
18	life support ambulances) or intermediate advanced emergency_

4	"Regional medical advisory committee." A medical advisory
5	committee established by a regional emergency medical services
6	council under section 8109(c)(11) (relating to regional
7	emergency medical services councils).
8	"Regional quality improvement committee." A quality
9	improvement committee established by a regional emergency
10	medical services council under section 8109(c)(11).

12	Section 2. Section 8129(1) of Title 35 is amended to read:
13	§ 8129. Emergency medical services agencies.

15	(1) Staffing
16	(1) The department may by regulation revise the staffing
17	standards for ambulances, squad vehicles and quick response
18	services set forth in sections 8130 (relating to advanced
19	life support ambulances), 8131 (relating to air ambulances),
20	8132 (relating to advanced life support squad vehicles), 8133
21	(relating to basic life support ambulances), 8134 (relating
22	to basic life support squad vehicles) and 8135 (relating to
23	quick response services).
24	(2) The following apply:
25	(i) At the request of one or more qualified
26	applicants which are licensed under the purview of the
27	regional emergency medical services council, a regional
28	emergency medical services council may submit an
29	application to the department to waive the requirements
30	of sections 8130(b) and 8133(b) in accordance with

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1	subparagraph (iii) within the geographic area of the
2	regional emergency medical services council. Multiple
3	regional emergency medical services councils may submit a
4	joint application under this paragraph. The department
5	may only disapprove an application for reasons of
6	insufficiency.
7	(ii) Upon approval of an application for a waiver
8	under subparagraph (i), the following apply:
9	(A) The regional quality improvement committee
10	and the regional medical advisory committee for a
11	regional emergency medical services council that was
12	approved for a waiver under subparagraph (i) shall
13	enter into an agreement with the department to manage
14	the emergency medical services agencies' compliance
15	with the waiver on behalf of the department. The
16	agreement may establish reporting and quality control
17	requirements.
18	(B) A regional quality improvement committee
19	which has entered into an agreement under clause (A)
20	may enter into an agreement with an emergency medical
21	services agency to manage the emergency medical
22	services agency's compliance with the waiver.
23	(iii) The following apply:
24	(A) Notwithstanding the provisions of section
25	8130(b), an emergency medical services agency that
26	<u>has entered into an agreement under subparagraph (ii)</u>
27	(B) may field a transport-capable advanced life
28	support ambulance that is staffed by an emergency
29	medical services provider who is certified as a
30	paramedic or higher and an emergency medical services

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1		<u>vehicle operator.</u>
2		(B) Notwithstanding the provisions of section
3		8133(b), an emergency medical services agency that
4		<u>has entered into an agreement under subparagraph (ii)</u>
5		(B) may field a transport-capable ambulance that is
6		staffed by an emergency medical services provider who
7		is certified as an emergency medical technician or
8		higher and an emergency medical services vehicle
9		<u>operator.</u>

11 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
