- Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania
- Consolidated Statutes, in epinephrine auto-injector entities, further providing for definitions and for epinephrine auto-
- injectors for authorized entities. 4
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The definitions of "authorized entity" and
- 8 "epinephrine auto-injector" in section 5502 of Title 35 of the
- Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- § 5502. Definitions. 10
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 12 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 * * *
- "Authorized entity." Any entity or organization, other than 15
- a school entity or a nonpublic school under section 1414.2 of 16
- the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public 17

- 1 School Code of 1949, which has an employee or agent who has
- 2 completed the required training and at which allergens capable
- 3 of causing anaphylaxis may be present, including, but not
- 4 limited to:
- 5 (1) recreation camps;
- 6 (2) colleges and universities;
- 7 [(3) day-care facilities;]
- 8 (4) youth sports leagues;
- 9 (5) amusement parks;
- 10 (6) restaurants;
- 11 (7) places of employment;
- 12 (8) sports arenas; and
- 13 (9) law enforcement agencies.

- 15 "Epinephrine auto-injector." A single-use device used for
- 16 the automatic injection of a premeasured appropriate weight-
- 17 <u>based</u> dose of epinephrine into the human body.

- 19 Section 2. Section 5503 of the act is amended to read:
- 20 § 5503. Epinephrine auto-injectors for authorized entities and
- 21 <u>day-care facilities</u>.
- 22 (a) Prescribing and dispensing. -- Notwithstanding any
- 23 provision of law to the contrary, a health care practitioner
- 24 with prescriptive authority may prescribe epinephrine auto-
- 25 injectors in the name of an authorized entity or day-care
- 26 <u>facility</u> for use in accordance with this section. Pharmacists
- 27 and health care practitioners may dispense epinephrine auto-
- 28 injectors pursuant to a prescription issued in the name of an
- 29 authorized entity or day-care facility.
- 30 (b) Supply.--

| 1 | [(1)] An authorized entity may acquire and stock a |
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| 2 | supply of epinephrine auto-injectors pursuant to a |
| 3 | prescription issued in accordance with this section. [The |

| 22 | (1) An epinephrine auto-injector shall be stored: |
| 23 | (i) in a location readily accessible in an |

| 27 | <pre>for use; and</pre> |

- 6 (c) Use. -- An employee or agent of an authorized entity or
- 7 other individual associated with the entity or day-care facility
- 8 who has completed the training required under subsection (d) may
- 9 use epinephrine auto-injectors prescribed under subsection (a)
- 10 to do any of the following:
- 11 (1) Provide an epinephrine auto-injector for immediate
- administration to any individual, or the parent, guardian or
- caregiver of the individual, who the employee, agent or other
- individual associated with the entity believes, in good
- faith, is experiencing anaphylaxis, regardless of whether the
- individual has a prescription for an epinephrine auto-
- injector or has previously been diagnosed with an allergy.
- 18 (2) Administer an epinephrine auto-injector to any
- individual who the employee, agent or other individual
- believes, in good faith, is experiencing anaphylaxis,
- 21 regardless of whether the individual has a prescription for
- an epinephrine auto-injector or has previously been diagnosed
- with an allergy.
- 24 (d) Training.--
- 25 (1) An employee or agent of the authorized entity or
- other individual associated with the entity or day-care
- 27 <u>facility</u> shall complete an anaphylaxis training program as
- required by the department. The training shall be conducted
- by a nationally recognized organization experienced in
- training laypersons in emergency health treatment, a health

- 1 care practitioner employed or contracted by the authorized
- 2 entity or day-care facility, or an entity or individual
- approved by the department. The department may approve
- 4 specific entities or individuals or may approve classes of
- 5 entities or individuals to conduct the training. Training may
- 6 be conducted online or in person and, at a minimum, shall
- 7 cover:
- 8 (i) how to recognize signs and symptoms of severe
- 9 allergic reactions, including anaphylaxis;
- 10 (ii) standards and procedures for the storage and
- administration of an epinephrine auto-injector; and
- 12 (iii) emergency follow-up procedures.
- 13 (2) The entity or individual that conducts the training
- shall issue a certificate, on a form developed or approved by
- the department, to each individual who successfully completes
- the anaphylaxis training program.
- 17 (d.1) Informational materials for day-care facilities.--The
- 18 department, in consultation with the Department of Human
- 19 Services, shall develop, within 90 days of the effective date of
- 20 this subsection, informational materials for a day-care facility
- 21 to distribute to a parent or quardian of a child in the
- 22 <u>facility's care. The following shall apply:</u>
- 23 (1) The materials shall include the following:
- (i) Signs and symptoms of allergic reactions,
- 25 including anaphylaxis.
- 26 (ii) The requirements under subsections (a), (b),
- (b.1), (c) and (d).
- 28 <u>(2) The department shall update the informational</u>
- 29 <u>materials on a triennial basis.</u>
- 30 (3) A day-care facility shall provide the informational

- 1 <u>materials to a parent or quardian of a child in its care on</u>
- 2 <u>an annual basis.</u>

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- 3 (e) Good Samaritan protections.--
- 4 (1) The following shall not be liable for any injuries 5 or related damages that result from any act or omission taken 6 under this section:
 - (i) An authorized entity or day-care facility that possesses and makes available epinephrine auto-injectors and its employees, agents and other individuals associated with the entity;
 - (ii) a health care practitioner that prescribes or dispenses epinephrine auto-injectors to an authorized entity or day-care facility;
 - (iii) a pharmacist or health care practitioner that dispenses epinephrine auto-injectors to an authorized entity or day-care facility; and
 - (iv) an individual or entity that conducts the training described under subsection (d).
 - (2) The immunity provided under paragraph (1) shall not apply to acts or omissions constituting intentional misconduct or gross negligence.
 - (3) The administration of an epinephrine auto-injector in accordance with this section shall not be considered the practice of medicine or any other profession that otherwise requires licensure.
- 26 (4) This subsection shall not eliminate, limit or reduce 27 any other immunity or defense that may be available under 28 law, including that provided under 42 Pa.C.S. § 8332 29 (relating to emergency response provider and bystander good 30 Samaritan civil immunity).

- 1 (5) An entity located in this Commonwealth shall not be 2 liable for any injuries or related damages that result from 3 the provision or administration of an epinephrine auto-4 injector outside of this Commonwealth if the entity:
 - (i) would not have been liable for the injuries or related damages had the provision or administration occurred within this Commonwealth; or
 - (ii) is not liable for the injuries or related damages under the law of the state in which the provision or administration occurred.
- 11 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
