## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in abortion, further providing for
- prohibited acts; and abrogating regulations.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 3213(c) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 3213. Prohibited acts.
- 9 \* \* \*
- 10 (c) [Regulations.--The department shall issue regulations to
- 11 assure that prior to the performance of any abortion, including
- 12 abortions performed in the first trimester of pregnancy, the
- 13 maternal Rh status shall be determined and that anti-Rh
- 14 sensitization prophylaxis shall be provided to each patient at
- 15 risk of sensitization unless the patient refuses to accept the
- 16 treatment. Except when there exists a medical emergency or, in
- 17 the judgment of the physician, there exists no possibility of Rh

- 1 sensitization, the intentional, knowing, or reckless failure to
- 2 conform to the regulations issued pursuant to this subsection
- 3 constitutes "unprofessional conduct" and his license for the
- 4 practice of medicine and surgery shall be subject to suspension
- 5 or revocation in accordance with procedures provided under the
- 6 act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), known as the
- 7 Osteopathic Medical Practice Act, the act of December 20, 1985
- 8 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical Practice Act of 1985, or
- 9 their successor acts.] (Reserved).

- 11 Section 2. The provisions of 28 Pa. Code § 29.33(6) and (7)
- 12 are abrogated.
- 13 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
