AN ACT

Amending the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), entitled

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"An act providing for access to public information, for a 2 designated open-records officer in each Commonwealth agency, 3 local agency, judicial agency and legislative agency, for procedure, for appeal of agency determination, for judicial review and for the Office of Open Records; imposing penalties; providing for reporting by State-related 7 institutions; requiring the posting of certain State contract information on the Internet; and making related repeals," in State-related institutions, further providing for reporting, 10 for contents of report and for copies and posting and 11 providing for contracts. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. Sections 1502, 1503 and 1504 of the act of 16 February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, are amended to read: 17 18 Section 1502. [Reporting.] Filing. 19 No later than May 30 of each year, unless otherwise provided 20 under this chapter, a State-related institution shall file [with 21 the Governor's Office, the General Assembly, the Auditor General and the State Library] the information set forth in section 1503 22

- 1 <u>as required under section 1504</u>.
- 2 Section 1503. Contents of [report.] filing.
- 3 (a) Information included. -- The [report] filing required
- 4 under section 1502 shall include the following:
- 5 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (4), all information
- 6 required by Form 990 or an equivalent form of the United
- 7 States Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service,
- 8 entitled the Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax,
- 9 regardless of whether the State-related institution is
- 10 required to file the form by the Federal Government.
- 11 (2) The salaries of all officers and directors of the 12 State-related institution.
- 13 (3) The highest 25 salaries paid to employees of the
- institution that are not included under paragraph (2)[.] and,
- for a State-related institution with 2,500 employees or more,
- the next highest 175 salaries paid to employees of the
- institution that are not included under paragraph (2).
- 18 Faculty members' salaries shall be presented in salary
- 19 ranges.
- 20 (4) The [report] <u>filing</u> shall not include information
- 21 relating to individual donors.
- 22 (5) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the State-related
- 23 institution's academic and administrative support units for
- the current fiscal year.
- 25 (6) The actual revenue and expenditures for the prior
- 26 year.
- 27 (7) For any defined project or program which is the
- subject of a specific line item appropriation from the
- 29 General Fund, the State-related institution shall disclose
- 30 the following:

1	(i) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the defined
2	program or project for the current fiscal year.
3	(ii) The actual revenue and expenditures of the
4	defined program or project for the prior year.
5	(8) The revenue and expenditures of any auxiliary
6	enterprise which is directly funded in whole or in part by
7	tuition or a State appropriation for the current fiscal year.
8	(9) The most recent audited financial statement for the
9	State-related institution.
10	(10) The following information for the prior fiscal year
11	for each academic or administrative support unit, for each
12	defined project or program and for an auxiliary enterprise:
13	(i) The number of employees by academic rank.
14	(ii) The number of administrators, staff, clerical
15	and technical service employees, by classification.
16	(iii) Median and mean salary by academic rank.
17	(iv) Median and mean salaries of administrators,
18	staff, clerical and technical service employees, by
19	classification.
20	(v) Nonsalary compensation as a percentage of
21	salary. Nonsalary compensation shall include:
22	(A) Medical benefits.
23	(B) Life insurance benefits.
24	(C) Pension benefits.
25	(D) Leave benefits.
26	(E) Employer Social Security payments.
27	(F) Workers' compensation benefits.
28	(vi) A statement of the State-related institution's
29	retirement policies.
30	(vii) A policy statement relating to a reduction of

Τ	tuition for employees' family members.
2	(viii) A list by academic or administrative support
3	unit in the aggregate of the expenses of travel,
4	subsistence and lodging, whether provided or reimbursed.
5	(b) Providing information Each State-related institution
6	shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be
7	required by the Department of Education or the chairperson or
8	minority chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the
9	Senate or the chairperson or minority chairperson of the
10	Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.
11	(c) Financial statements Each State-related institution
12	shall present and report its financial statements required under
13	the provisions of this act in accordance with:
14	(1) The generally accepted accounting principles as
15	prescribed by the National Association of College and
16	University Business Officers, the American Institute of
17	Certified Public Accountants or by another recognized
18	authoritative body.
19	(2) The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions
20	for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related
21	Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities.
22	(3) The financial reporting policies and standards
23	promulgated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by the
24	Federal Government that apply to the State-related
25	institutions.
26	(d) Appropriations
27	(1) In a year a State-related institution receives an
28	appropriation, a report shall be submitted prior to September
29	1 and shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the
30	summer term of the preceding year. The report shall include:

1	(i) The following counts and distributions for each
2	term during the period:
3	(A) The definition and number of:
4	(I) Faculty members employed full time.
5	(II) Faculty members employed part time.
6	(III) Full-time students enrolled in a
7	graduate course.
8	(IV) Full-time students enrolled in an
9	undergraduate course.
10	(V) Part-time students enrolled in a
11	graduate course.
12	(VI) Part-time students enrolled in an
13	undergraduate course.
14	(B) The total number of:
15	(I) Undergraduate student credit hours,
16	divided into lower division and upper division
17	course levels.
18	(II) Graduate student credit hours, divided
19	<pre>into three course levels: master's, first</pre>
20	professional and doctoral.
21	(C) The number of different courses scheduled by
22	level of instruction and the number of sections of
23	individual instruction scheduled by level of
24	instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit
25	Classification of Instructional Program (CIP)
26	categories of instructional programs of higher
27	education as defined by the National Center for
28	Education Statistics, United States Department of
29	Education.
30	(D) The number of terms scheduled and the dates

1	of the terms.
2	(ii) For the summer term and the following academic
3	year in total and for each two-digit CIP program
4	<pre>category:</pre>
5	(A) A classification of faculty members or other
6	professional employees by title, including:
7	(I) Professor.
8	(II) Associate professor.
9	(III) Assistant professor.
10	(IV) Instructor.
11	(V) Lecturer.
12	(VI) Research associate.
13	(VII) Librarian and academic administrator.
14	(B) Faculty members or other professional
15	employees under each title to be subdivided into
16	teaching and nonteaching.
17	(C) Each set of faculty members or other
18	professional employees to be further subdivided by
19	full-time or part-time employment.
20	(D) The following aggregates for each
21	<pre>subdivided classification:</pre>
22	(I) The number of faculty and other
23	professional employees and the full-time
24	equivalence in instructional and noninstructional
25	functions.
26	(II) The sum of credits assigned to
27	undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of
28	credits assigned to graduate classroom courses
29	taught divided into lower division, upper

Τ	doctoral course levels.
2	(III) The sum of credits assigned to
3	undergraduate individual instruction courses and
4	the sum of credits assigned to graduate
5	individual instruction courses taught divided
6	into lower division, upper division, master's,
7	first professional and doctoral course levels.
8	(IV) The sum of undergraduate classroom
9	student credit hours and the sum of graduate
10	classroom student credit hours generated, divided
11	into lower division, upper division, master's,
12	first professional and doctoral course levels.
13	(V) The sum of undergraduate individual
14	instruction student credit hours and the sum of
15	graduate individual instruction student credit
16	hours generated, divided into lower division,
17	upper division, master's, first professional and
18	doctoral course levels.
19	(VI) The total salary paid for instructional
20	functions and for noninstructional functions and
21	the amount of salary paid for each of these
22	functions from State-related institution funds,
23	Federal funds and other funds.
24	(iii) For each term of the period covered for each
25	faculty member employed full-time identified by two-digit
26	CIP program category and title, the report shall contain
27	an analysis of the average hours per week spent:
28	(A) In State-related institution-related
29	activities, stating specifically hours spent in
30	undergraduate classroom contact and graduate

	crassioom contact hours spent in preparation.
2	(B) In research.
3	(C) In public service.
4	(2) The report covering the 12-month period shall
5	include for each program of the State-related institution:
6	(i) Minimum number of credits required for a
7	baccalaureate and a master's degree.
8	(ii) Number of bachelor's, master's, first
9	professional and doctoral degrees awarded for the
10	previous five years and those estimates for that year.
11	(e) MinutesEach State-related institution shall make a
12	copy of the minutes of each public meeting of the institution's
13	board of trustees available for public inspection in the
14	institution's library in print format and online on the
15	institution's publicly accessible Internet website. The minutes
16	shall be maintained in print and online for no fewer than 20
17	years.
18	(f) Data systems report Each State-related university
19	shall make a copy of the institution's integrated postsecondary
20	education data systems report available for public inspection in
21	the institution's library in print format and online on the
22	institution's publicly accessible Internet website.
23	Section 1504. [Copies and posting.] Requirements for
24	information in filings.
25	[A State-related institution shall maintain, for at least
26	seven years, a copy of the report in the institution's library
27	and shall provide free access to the report on the institution's
28	Internet website.] A State-related institution shall make the
29	information required under section 1502 accessible to the public
30	in accordance with the following:

- 1 (1) The information shall be posted online on the
- 2 institution's publicly accessible Internet website in a
- 3 searchable, sortable and downloadable database format that is
- 4 <u>freely accessible by the public. To the extent possible, a</u>
- 5 <u>State-related institution shall post the information online</u>
- in a similar manner in order to facilitate easy public
- 7 review. The information of prior years shall be maintained
- 8 <u>for no fewer than 10 years.</u>
- 9 <u>(2) The information shall be maintained in print format</u>
- in the institution's library for no fewer than 10 years.
- 11 (3) The information shall be provided in electronic
- format to the Department of Education and the Joint State
- 13 Government Commission.
- 14 (4) The information shall be provided in print format to
- the General Assembly and to each of the State regional
- 16 <u>library resource centers.</u>
- 17 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 18 Section 1505. Contracts.
- 19 (a) Scope.--By May 30 of each year, a State-related
- 20 institution shall file with the Governor's Office, the Secretary
- 21 of the Senate, the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives
- 22 and the State Library an annual list of contracts in excess of
- 23 \$5,000 for the purchase of all goods and third-party services.
- 24 (b) Contents. -- The list shall include all of the following:
- 25 (1) Date of execution.
- 26 (2) Amount of the contract.
- 27 (3) Beginning date of the contract.
- 28 (4) End date of the contract, if applicable.
- 29 (5) The name and address of the vendor.
- 30 (6) Subject matter of the contract.

- 1 (c) Privilege. -- This section shall not apply to a contract
- 2 <u>for services protected by a privilege.</u>
- 3 (d) Evidence.--This section:
- 4 (1) Shall apply to a purchase order evidencing new
- 5 obligations.
- 6 (2) Shall not apply to a purchase order evidencing
- 7 <u>fulfillment of an existing contract.</u>
- 8 (e) Posting. -- Information under this section shall be posted
- 9 and maintained on the institution's publicly accessible Internet
- 10 website.
- 11 Section 3. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 12 (1) The addition of section 1505 of the act shall take
- effect in 60 days.
- 14 (2) This section shall take effect immediately.
- 15 (3) The remainder of this act shall take effect July 1,
- 2019, or immediately, whichever is later.
