AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the Pennsylvania Officer Down Advisory;
- authorizing and directing the Pennsylvania State Police to
- 3 establish and maintain the Pennsylvania Officer Down
- Advisory; assessing costs; and providing for immunity and
- 5 penalties.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 10 Officer Down Advisory Act.
- 11 Section 2. Pennsylvania Officer Down Advisory established.
- 12 The Pennsylvania State Police shall establish and maintain
- 13 the Pennsylvania Officer Down Advisory to assist in the
- 14 apprehension of those suspected of killing or seriously injuring
- 15 Federal, State or local law enforcement officers through prompt
- 16 notification to the general public and appropriate law
- 17 enforcement authorities. The Pennsylvania State Police shall

- 1 establish such protocols and procedures as are necessary for the
- 2 effective operation of this advisory and shall educate and
- 3 inform local law enforcement agencies and the public with regard
- 4 to its availability. At a minimum the following criteria must be
- 5 met to activate the advisory:
- 6 (1) A law enforcement officer must have been killed or
- 7 seriously injured by a suspect.
- 8 (2) The investigating law enforcement agency must
- 9 determine that the suspect poses a serious risk or threat to
- 10 the public or other law enforcement personnel.
- 11 (3) A detailed description of the make and model of the
- suspect's vehicle or a complete or partial registration plate
- number of the suspect's vehicle must be available for
- 14 broadcast to the public.
- 15 (4) The investigating law enforcement agency having
- jurisdiction must recommend activation of the advisory.
- 17 Section 3. Prohibited use.
- 18 The transmission, broadcast or other communication of a
- 19 public alert, other than through the Pennsylvania Officer Down
- 20 Advisory, intentionally, knowingly, recklessly or negligently
- 21 purporting to be made by, with or through the authority of the
- 22 Pennsylvania Officer Down Advisory is prohibited and shall be
- 23 subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000.
- 24 Section 4. Coordination with other jurisdictions.
- The Pennsylvania State Police shall coordinate with the
- 26 authorities of the Federal Government and the various states
- 27 that are responsible within their respective jurisdictions for
- 28 the apprehension of those suspected of killing or seriously
- 29 injuring Federal, State or local law enforcement officers to
- 30 establish and execute the procedures appropriate to the

- 1 effective fulfillment of its responsibilities under section 2.
- 2 Section 5. Assessment of cost.
- 3 Unless the court finds that undue hardship would result, in
- 4 addition to any other cost imposed by law, a cost of \$25 shall
- 5 automatically be assessed on each person convicted, adjudicated
- 6 delinquent or granted accelerated rehabilitative disposition
- 7 (ARD) of the offenses named in this section. The cost shall be
- 8 forwarded to the Commonwealth and used by the Pennsylvania State
- 9 Police to establish and maintain the Pennsylvania Officer Down
- 10 Advisory and apply to the following offenses:
- 11 18 Pa.C.S. § 2507 (relating to criminal homicide of law
- 12 enforcement officer).
- 13 18 Pa.C.S. § 2702.1 (relating to assault of law
- enforcement officer).
- 15 18 Pa.C.S. § 5104 (relating to resisting arrest or other
- law enforcement).
- 17 18 Pa.C.S. § 5104.1 (relating to disarming law
- 18 enforcement officer).
- 19 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511.2 (relating to police animals).
- 20 Section 6. Immunity.
- Owners, licensees, operators and employees of a communication
- 22 medium, including, but not limited to, telephone, radio,
- 23 television, newspaper, digital communications network, wireless
- 24 communications network or global communications network, shall
- 25 be immune from civil liability for their good faith conduct
- 26 while participating in accordance with this act.
- 27 Section 20. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 30 days.
