AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in powers and duties of the Department of State 21 22 and its departmental administrative board, establishing the 23 Pharmaceutical Collection Sites Educational Program. 24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 25 hereby enacts as follows: 26 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 27 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a

- 1 Section 817. Pharmaceutical Collection Sites Educational

- 3 Program is established within the Department of State. The
- 4 program shall assist, as requested, in the State Board of
- 5 Pharmacy's efforts to educate pharmacies on pharmacies' ability
- 6 to modify their registration with the United States Drug
- 7 Enforcement Administration under 21 U.S.C. §§ 822(q) (relating
- 8 to persons required to register) and 828(b) (relating to order
- 9 forms) and 21 CFR 1301.51 (relating to modification in
- 10 registration) to receive and destroy mail-back packages and to
- 11 <u>install, manage and maintain collection receptacles for</u>
- 12 prescription drugs.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
