AN ACT

- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in other required equipment, further providing for restraint systems.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 4581(a) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 4581. Restraint systems.
- 9 (a) Occupant protection. --
- 10 (1) (i) Except as provided under subparagraph (ii), any
- 11 person who is operating a passenger car, [Class I truck,
- 12 Class II truck,] truck, truck tractor, classic motor
- 13 vehicle, antique motor vehicle or motor home and who
- transports a child under four years of age anywhere in
- 15 the motor vehicle, including the cargo area, shall fasten
- such child securely in a child passenger restraint
- 17 system, as provided in subsection (d).

(ii) Any person who is operating a passenger car, [Class I truck, Class II truck,] truck, truck tractor, classic motor vehicle, antique motor vehicle or motor home and who transports a child under two years of age anywhere in the motor vehicle shall fasten such child securely in a rear-facing child passenger restraint system, to be used until the child outgrows the maximum weight and height limits designated by the manufacturer, as provided in subsection (d).

(iii) This paragraph shall apply to all persons while they are operators of motor vehicles where a seating position is available which is equipped with a seat safety belt or other means to secure the systems

[or], where the seating position was originally equipped <-with seat safety belts[.] OR WHERE THE SEATING POSITION <-IS EQUIPPED BY THE ORIGINAL MANUFACTURER TO INSTALL A

CHILD PASSENGER RESTRAINT SYSTEM OR REAR-FACING CHILD

PASSENGER RESTRAINT SYSTEM AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D).

(1.1) Any person who is operating a passenger car,

[Class I truck, Class II truck,] truck, truck tractor,

classic motor vehicle, antique motor vehicle or motor home
and who transports a child four years of age or older but
under eight years of age anywhere in the motor vehicle,
including the cargo area, shall fasten such child securely in
a fastened safety seat belt system and in an appropriately
fitting child booster seat, as provided in subsection (d).

This paragraph shall apply to all persons while they are
operators of motor vehicles where a seating position is
available which is equipped with a seat safety belt or other
means to secure the systems [or], where the seating position <---

5	(2) (i) The driver of a passenger car, [Class I truck,
6	Class II truck] truck, truck tractor or motor home
7	operated in this Commonwealth shall:
8	(A) if under 18 years of age, be secured in a
9	properly adjusted and fastened safety seat belt
10	system; and
11	(B) secure or cause to be secured in a properly
12	adjusted and fastened safety seat belt every vehicle
13	occupant eight years of age or older but under 18
14	years of age.
15	(ii) Except for children under 18 years of age and
16	except as provided in paragraphs (1) and (1.1) and
17	subparagraph (i), each driver and front seat occupant of
18	a passenger car, [Class I truck, Class II truck,] truck,
19	truck tractor, classic motor vehicle, antique motor
20	vehicle or motor home operated in this Commonwealth shall
21	wear a properly adjusted and fastened safety seat belt
22	system.
23	(iii) This paragraph shall not apply to:
24	(A) A driver or front seat occupant of any
25	vehicle manufactured before July 1, 1966.
26	(B) A driver or front seat occupant who
27	possesses a written verification from a physician
28	that he is unable to wear a safety seat belt system
29	for physical or medical reasons, or from a
30	psychiatrist or other specialist qualified to make an

informed judgment that he is unable to wear a safety
seat belt system for psychological reasons.

- (C) A rural letter carrier while operating any motor vehicle during the performance of his duties as a United States postal service rural letter carrier only between the first and last delivery points.
- (D) A driver who makes frequent stops and is traveling less than 15 miles per hour for the purpose of delivering goods or services while in the performance of his duties and only between the first and last delivery points.
- (iv) A violation of this paragraph shall not be subject to the assessment of any points under section 1535 (relating to schedule of convictions and points).
- (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1503(c)

 (2.1) (relating to persons ineligible for licensing; license issuance to minors; junior driver's license), a driver who is under 18 years of age may not operate a motor vehicle in which the number of passengers exceeds the number of available safety seat belts in the vehicle.
