## AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 14, 2006 (P.L.85, No.28), entitled "An act requiring State and local approval for terminations or transfers by municipal authorities; authorizing and requiring cities, boroughs, townships, municipal authorities and public utility companies engaged in the supplying of water to shut 5 off the supply of water for nonpayment of sewer, sewerage or 6 sewage treatment rentals, rates or charges imposed by 7 municipal authorities organized by counties of the second class, by cities of the second class, by cities of the second 9 class A, by cities of the third class, by boroughs or by 10 townships of the first or second class; authorizing and 11 requiring them to supply to such authorities lists of metered 12 water readings and flat-rate water bills and other data; 13 authorizing them to act as billing and collecting agents for 14 such authorities; conferring certain powers upon the 15 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission in connection 16 therewith; requiring certain procedures to be followed in 17 residential buildings; and making a related repeal," in 18 municipal authority approval of actions, further providing 19 for definitions. 20 21 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 22 hereby enacts as follows:
- 23 Section 1. The definitions of "authority" and "city" in
- 24 section 301 of the act of April 14, 2006 (P.L.85, No.28), known
- 25 as the Water Services Act, are amended to read:
- 26 Section 301. Definitions.

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 2 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 3 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 "Authority." A body politic and corporate which meets all of
- 5 the following:
- 6 (1) Is established by a city and incorporated under any
- 7 of the following:
- 8 (i) The former act of June 28, 1935 (P.L.463,
- 9 No.191), entitled, "An act providing, for a limited
- 10 period of time, for the incorporation, as bodies
- 11 corporate and politic, of 'Authorities' for
- municipalities; defining the same; prescribing the
- rights, powers, and duties of such Authorities;
- 14 authorizing such Authorities to acquire, construct,
- improve, maintain, and operate projects, and to borrow
- money and issue bonds therefor; providing for the payment
- of such bonds, and prescribing the rights of the holders
- thereof; conferring the right of eminent domain on such
- 19 Authorities; authorizing such Authorities to enter into
- 20 contracts with and to accept grants from the Federal
- 21 Government or any agency thereof; and for other
- 22 purposes."
- 23 (ii) The former act of May 2, 1945 (P.L.382,
- No.164), known as the Municipality Authorities Act of
- 25 1945.
- 26 (iii) 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 56 (relating to municipal
- authorities).
- 28 (2) Provides water [and] or sewer services in accordance
- 29 with all of the following:
- 30 (i) The water or sewer services, or both, are

- provided, either by an agreement with a municipality or directly, to users who are residents of one or more municipalities outside the boundaries of the city.
  - (ii) The total number of residents of municipalities which are outside the boundaries of the city and in which water or sewer services, or both, are offered or provided exceeds by at least 50% the number of residents who reside within the boundaries of the city.

## (3) Owns:

- 10 (i) a sewer, sewer system or parts of a sewer or
  11 sewer system or sewage treatment works; [and] or
- (ii) a waterworks, water supply works or waterdistribution system.
- "City." A city of the third class, including a city of the
- 15 third class which has adopted a home rule charter [and has a
- population of not more than 30,000].
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18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
