## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for vaccination schedule for pediatric patients and
- for coverage, compensation and reimbursement for
- 3 vaccinations; and imposing penalties.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Immunization
- 8 Freedom Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Centers for Disease Control and Prevention." The United
- 14 States Department of Health and Human Services Centers for
- 15 Disease Control and Prevention.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 17 "Health care facility." A facility which is licensed by the
- 18 department to operate as a health care facility under the act of

- 1 July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care
- 2 Facilities Act.
- 3 "Health care practitioner." As defined in section 103 of the
- 4 Health Care Facilities Act.
- 5 "Health care provider." An individual, a trust or estate, a
- 6 partnership, a corporation, the Commonwealth or a political
- 7 subdivision or instrumentality of the Commonwealth that operates
- 8 a health care facility.
- 9 "Health insurance policy." A policy, subscriber contract,
- 10 certificate or plan issued by an insurer that provides hospital,
- 11 medical or surgical health care coverage. The term does not
- 12 include any of the following:
- 13 (1) An accident only policy.
- 14 (2) A credit only policy.
- 15 (3) A long-term care or disability income policy.
- 16 (4) A specified disease policy.
- 17 (5) A Medicare supplement policy.
- 18 (6) A fixed indemnity policy.
- 19 (7) An adult-only dental only policy.
- 20 (8) A vision only policy.
- 21 (9) A workers' compensation policy.
- 22 (10) An automobile medical payment policy.
- 23 (11) A policy under which benefits are provided by the
- 24 Federal Government to active or former military personnel and
- 25 their dependents.
- 26 (12) Any other similar policies providing for limited
- 27 benefits.
- 28 "Insurer." An entity that offers, issues or renews an
- 29 individual or group health, accident or sickness insurance
- 30 policy, contract or plan, and that is governed under any of the

- 1 following:
- 2 (1) 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to hospital plan
- 3 corporations).
- 4 (2) 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to professional health
- 5 services plan corporations).
- 6 (3) The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as
- 7 The Insurance Company Law of 1921, including section 630 and
- 8 Article XXIV.
- 9 (4) The act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364),
- 10 known as the Health Maintenance Organization Act.
- "License." Any of the following:
- 12 (1) A license issued by a Commonwealth licensing agency
- or board to an individual to practice as a health care
- 14 practitioner.
- 15 (2) A license issued to a health care provider by the
- department to operate as a health care facility.
- 17 Section 3. Vaccination schedule for pediatric patients.
- 18 The following apply:
- 19 (1) A health care practitioner may not cease to provide
- 20 pediatric care to a patient when the parent or legal guardian
- of a patient chooses to utilize a vaccination schedule that
- 22 varies from the vaccination schedule recommended by the
- 23 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention if the patient
- receives no less than one vaccination each calendar year.
- 25 (2) A health care practitioner may request a meeting
- 26 with the parent or legal quardian of a patient receiving
- 27 pediatric care to discuss a proposed vaccination schedule.
- 28 The health care practitioner may not bill the patient, the
- 29 patient's parent or legal quardian or the patient's insurer
- for a meeting under this paragraph.

- 1 A health care practitioner may establish a secure waiting room in a health care facility for patients who 2 utilize a vaccination schedule that varies from the 3 vaccination schedule recommended by the Centers for Disease 4 5 Control and Prevention. Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to authorize a health care practitioner to limit 6 7 the hours when patients receiving pediatric care can schedule 8 their appointments with the health care practitioner in a 9 manner to restrict the ability of the patients to have their 10 health care needs met.
  - (4) Upon agreeing on a vaccination schedule with the parent or legal guardian of a patient receiving pediatric care, a health care practitioner may issue a standing order to a designee of the health care practitioner to ensure that the patient utilizes the vaccination schedule. A standing order under the paragraph may not prohibit the compensation or reimbursement of a health care practitioner for other services rendered by a health care practitioner.
- 19 Section 4. Coverage, compensation or reimbursement for vaccinations.
- 21 (a) Insurers.--An insurer may not refuse to provide coverage 22 under a health care policy or compensate or reimburse a health 23 care practitioner operating within the scope of his or her 24 practice for a vaccination administered on a schedule that 25 varies from the vaccination schedule recommended by the Centers
- 27 (b) Financial incentives. -- Except for compensating or

for Disease Control and Prevention.

- 28 reimbursing a health care practitioner for the cost of a
- 29 vaccination and the administration of a vaccination, an insurer
- 30 may not provide financial incentives to a health care

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- 1 practitioner to provide vaccinations on a per-member basis.
- 2 Section 5. Penalties.
- 3 A health care practitioner who violates section 3 shall be
- 4 subject to administrative penalties imposed before the health
- 5 care practitioner's Commonwealth licensing agency or board for
- 6 unprofessional conduct.
- 7 Section 6. Effective date.
- 8 This act shall take effect immediately.
