7	Section 1. Section 4913(b)(1) of Title 18 of the
8	Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and subsection (b)
9	is amended by adding a paragraph to read:
10	§ 4913. Impersonating a notary public or a holder of a

13	(b) Grading
14	(1) Except as set forth in paragraph (2) <u>or (3)</u> , an
15	offense under this section is a misdemeanor of the second
16	degree.

1	(3) If the intent of the actor is to impersonate a
2	doctor of medicine and, in so doing, the actor provides
3	medical advice or treatment to another person as a patient,
4	regardless of whether or not the other person suffers harm
5	from the medical advice or treatment, an offense under this
6	section is a misdemeanor of the first degree.
7	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
