AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled
2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the
3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
4 Executive Department thereof and the administrative
5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11 officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and
18 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation
19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of
20 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be
21 determined," in powers and duties of the Department of State
22 and its departmental administrative board, establishing the
23 Pharmaceutical Collection Sites Educational Program; and
24 making an appropriation.

25 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
26 hereby enacts as follows:

27 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
28 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
29 section to read:

1 Section 817. Pharmaceutical Collection Sites Educational
2 Program.--(a) The Pharmaceutical Collection Sites Educational
3 Program is established within the Department of State. The
4 program shall assist in the State Board of Pharmacy's efforts to
5 educate pharmacies on pharmacies' ability to modify their
6 registration with the United States Drug Enforcement
7 Administration under 21 U.S.C. §§ 822(g) (relating to persons
8 required to register) and 828(b) (relating to order forms) and
9 21 CFR 1301.51 (relating to modification in registration) to
10 receive and destroy mail-back packages and to install, manage
11 and maintain collection receptacles for prescription drugs.

12 (b) The sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) is hereby
13 appropriated on a continuing basis from the General Fund to the
14 Department of State to administer the Pharmaceutical Collection
15 Sites Educational Program established under subsection (a).
16 Money appropriated to the Department of State shall be used in a
17 manner, as determined by the Department of State, exclusively
18 for the education of pharmacies on their ability to modify their
19 registration with the United States Drug Enforcement
20 Administration to receive and destroy mail-back packages and to
21 install, manage and maintain collection receptacles for
22 prescription drugs.

23 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
