7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
9	as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to

11	Section 438. Waiver to Purchase Diapers or Menstrual Hygiene
12	Products(A) If, in accordance with Federal law, the Food and <
13	Nutrition Service of the United States Department of Agriculture
14	creates and makes available to the states a waiver permitting
15	recipients of benefits provided under the Supplemental Nutrition

1	Assistance Program (SNAP) or the Special Supplemental Nutrition
2	Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) to use their
3	benefits to purchase diapers or menstrual hygiene products,
4	including tampons, sanitary napkins or feminine wipes, the
5	following shall apply:
6	(1) If a waiver is made available for SNAP, the department
7	<pre>shall MAY apply for the Federal waiver. If the waiver is</pre> <
8	approved, the department shall adopt rules and make changes as
9	necessary to implement the waiver.
10	(2) If a waiver is made available for WIC, the Department of
11	Health shall MAY apply for the Federal waiver. If the waiver is <
12	approved, the Department of Health shall adopt rules and make
13	changes as necessary to implement the waiver.
14	(3) THE AUTHORITY TO IMPLEMENT A WAIVER APPROVED UNDER <
15	PARAGRAPH (1) OR (2) SHALL EXPIRE THREE YEARS FROM THE DATE THAT
16	THE WAIVER IS APPROVED.
17	(B) THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE SHALL
18	CONDUCT A STUDY TO REVIEW THE COSTS TO THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE
19	IMPLEMENTATION OF ANY WAIVER UNDER SUBSECTION (A) THAT OCCURS
20	DURING THE THREE-YEAR PERIOD AFTER THE WAIVER IS APPROVED IN
21	ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A). THE FOLLOWING APPLY:
22	(1) WITHIN TWO YEARS OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A WAIVER UNDER
23	SUBSECTION (A), THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE
24	SHALL ISSUE A REPORT CONTAINING THE FINDINGS OF THE STUDY
25	REGARDING THE WAIVER.
26	(2) THE REPORT UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE
27	FOLLOWING:
28	(I) THE GOVERNOR.
29	(II) THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE HEALTH
30	AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE.
