13 WHEREAS, Veterans have a higher workforce participation than

1 nonveterans; and

2 WHEREAS, Individuals in public service have a duty to serve
3 those who have served our country; and

5 responsibility to recognize the service and sacrifice of
6 veterans and extend our continued support; therefore be it
