A RESOLUTION

- Designating February 15, 2021, as "Plastic Pollution Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, More than 8 billion metric tons of plastic has been
- 4 produced globally since the 1950s; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Of the 8 billion metric tons of plastic produced,
- 6 approximately 6.3 billion metric tons of that has been turned
- 7 into waste; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Only 9% of plastic waste has been recycled and 12%
- 9 has been incinerated, with the rest winding up in landfills,
- 10 rivers and oceans; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Between 60% and 80% of all marine litter is plastic,
- 12 with more than 5 trillion pieces of plastic in our oceans; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Plastic pollution costs \$13 billion in economic
- 14 damage to marine systems globally each year; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Half of all plastic has been manufactured and
- 16 produced in the last 15 years; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Studies show that even with comprehensive recycling

- 1 plans in place globally, there could be 710 million metric tons
- 2 of plastic on our planet by 2040; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Single-use plastics account for 40% of all plastic
- 4 production each year; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Commonwealth consumers and retailers should be
- 6 encouraged to use paper straws, reusable bags and other
- 7 environmentally friendly alternatives to single-use disposable
- 8 plastic products; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Commonwealth businesses should strive to reduce
- 10 their plastic footprint by developing and adopting improved
- 11 environmental best practices; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The health and welfare of the environment and
- 13 resources of this Commonwealth depend, in great measure, upon
- 14 the dedication of private and corporate residents working
- 15 together to achieve the common goal of sustainability; therefore
- 16 be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
- 18 February 15, 2021, as "Plastic Pollution Awareness Day" in
- 19 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That residents of this Commonwealth consider a
- 21 pledge to honor "Plastic Pollution Awareness Day" by
- 22 volunteering on that day to aid in the cleanup efforts of local
- 23 streets, rivers, lakes or beaches and refusing to use single-use
- 24 disposable plastic products.
