A RESOLUTION

1 Designating June 21, 2013, as "John Smith Day" in
2 Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, John Smith was an English explorer who played a
4 pivotal role in the exploration and settlement of America; and

5 WHEREAS, Born in Willoughby, England, in late 1579 or early
6 1580, Smith was the first English explorer to map the Chesapeake
7 Bay area and New England, which helped ensure the success of
8 early English colonization efforts; and

9 WHEREAS, At the age of 27, Smith was one of the colonists who
10 embarked on the first Virginia Company expedition to the
11 Chesapeake region; and

12 WHEREAS, He became one of the leaders of Jamestown and
13 undertook two landmark voyages of the Chesapeake Bay; and

14 WHEREAS, John Smith is credited with saving Jamestown through
15 his leadership, organizational ability, fighting skills and
16 talent for building alliances and trading relationships with the

1 native people of the Chesapeake; and

2 WHEREAS, Upon returning to England, Smith published his
3 journals and maps, describing lush resources and his encounters
4 with the native people of the Chesapeake; and

5 WHEREAS, John Smith explored the coasts of modern day Maine
6 and Massachusetts in 1614 and 1615, for which he published maps
7 of what he coined as "New England"; and

8 WHEREAS, Although obscured by legend and lore, Smith's real
9 achievements are an instrumental part of American history; and

10 WHEREAS, John Smith died at the age of 51 in 1631; and

11 WHEREAS, John Smith was an outstanding leader, explorer,
12 diplomat and communicator who made a lasting mark on America;
13 therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate June
15 21, 2013, as "John Smith Day" in Pennsylvania.
