## A RESOLUTION

Designating the week of June 24 through 28, 2024, as "Union Organizing Week" in Pennsylvania, in honor of those workers 2 who have fought for their right to organize and bargain collectively at their workplace. 4 5 WHEREAS, The right of workers to organize and bargain collectively must be IS the right of every Pennsylvania worker 6 7 in every sector of the economy; and 8 WHEREAS, The right to organize and bargain collectively OFTEN <-benefits workers by improving workplace safety and providing for 10 fair wages, health care, retirement security, stable schedules, 11 due process, equal pay and other benefits; and 12 WHEREAS, The decision to unionize AND PARTICIPATE IN UNION 13 ACTIVITIES is entirely the choice of workers; and 14 WHEREAS, Employers MAY benefit from unionization in many <-ways, including improved productivity, workplace safety and 15 16 training; and 17 WHEREAS, Nonunionized workforces MAY also benefit from <--

- 1 unionized workforces through such things as increased wages,
- 2 benefits and safety standards; and
- 3 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth and the nation have benefited from
- 4 Pennsylvania's unionized workforces, THAT INCLUDE A DIVERSE <-
- 5 GROUP OF WORKERS, INCLUDING VETERANS, which have powered our
- 6 country, built our middle class and lifted millions from
- 7 poverty, among other benefits; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Unions FREQUENTLY help reduce wage gaps for women <--
- 9 workers and discrimination for workers of color; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Workers often SOMETIMES must overcome employer <--
- 11 interference in their unionization decision in the form of
- 12 captive audience meetings and other unfair labor practices; and <--
- WHEREAS, EMPLOYERS SHOULD WORK WITH UNIONS TO PROVIDE THE <--
- 14 BEST OUTCOME FOR THE MUTUAL SUCCESS AND SUSTAINABILITY OF THE
- 15 BUSINESS AND WORKERS; AND
- 16 WHEREAS, Some employers attempt to deny, stall or impede the
- 17 process of reaching a first contract with a new bargaining unit,
- 18 in an attempt to circumvent and undermine the will of their
- 19 workers; therefore be it AND
- 20 WHEREAS, THE HARDWORKING MEN AND WOMEN OF THIS COMMONWEALTH,

- 21 INCLUDING VETERANS, WHO HAVE UNITED TO FORM UNIONS HAVE
- 22 DISPLAYED IMMENSE COURAGE AND DEDICATION IN ADVOCATING FOR THEIR
- 23 FELLOW EMPLOYEES, PROMOTING A SENSE OF SOLIDARITY AND AMPLIFYING
- 24 THE VOICES OF WORKERS WHO SEEK FAIR TREATMENT; AND
- 25 WHEREAS, THE UNION NEGOTIATORS WHO TIRELESSLY ADVOCATE FOR
- 26 THE RIGHTS AND WELL-BEING OF UNION MEMBERS, ENSURING THE FAIR
- 27 AND RESPECTFUL TREATMENT OF EVERY WORKER THAT THEY REPRESENT ARE
- 28 PARTICULARLY DESERVING OF RECOGNITION; AND
- 29 WHEREAS, ORGANIZED WORKERS CONTRIBUTE THEIR SKILLS,
- 30 DEDICATION AND HARD WORK ACROSS THIS COMMONWEALTH, THROUGH THEIR

- 1 COMMITMENT, RESILIENCE AND PASSION, WHICH HAS BEEN A DRIVING
- 2 FORCE BEHIND THE GROWTH AND PROSPERITY OF THIS COMMONWEALTH,
- 3 WITH THE GOAL OF CREATING A THRIVING ECONOMY, FLOURISHING
- 4 COMMUNITIES AND IMPROVING THE LIVES AND WELL-BEING OF EVERY
- 5 INDIVIDUAL IN THIS COMMONWEALTH; THEREFORE BE IT
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 7 week of June 24 through 28, 2024, as "Union Organizing Week" in
- 8 Pennsylvania, in honor of those workers who have fought for
- 9 their right to organize and bargain collectively at their
- 10 workplace; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 12 continuing struggle EFFORTS of Pennsylvania workers to organize <--
- 13 and bargain collectively at their workplace; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
- 15 workers to know and exercise their rights, in a manner best
- 16 suited to improve work environments and their family living
- 17 conditions, while maintaining the workplace reputation for
- 18 producing high quality products and services in this
- 19 Commonwealth.
