1 2 3 4	Encouraging the National Fire Protection Association to consider economic impact, to include additional active firefighters and to allow for more fire department AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL < SERVICES input.
5	WHEREAS, Volunteer emergency services organizations are
6	experiencing ever-increasing financial burdens; and
7	WHEREAS, The increasing financial burden and costs are having
8	an adverse and serious negative impact upon maintaining and
9	providing adequate emergency services response capabilities for
10	communities across this Commonwealth; and
11	WHEREAS, Volunteer emergency services organizations can no
12	longer realistically afford to be expected to exist and provide
13	services at financial losses; and
14	WHEREAS, The emergency services in this Commonwealth are
15	being tasked to provide even greater levels of service with very
16	limited resources; and
17	WHEREAS, The National Fire Protection Association provides

- 1 uniform standards for firefighting equipment and apparatus,
- 2 APPARATUS AND AMBULANCES; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The association last updated these standards on
- 4 January 1, 2009; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Many of the updated standards that have been
- 6 implemented have increased the cost that Pennsylvania's fire AND <--
- 7 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (EMS) companies have to bear; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Some of the additional standards for apparatus
- 9 include a black box recorder as well as an electronic vehicle
- 10 stability control device; and
- 11 WHEREAS, THE ASSOCIATION IS CURRENTLY REVIEWING NFPA 1917, <--
- 12 "STANDARD FOR AUTOMOTIVE AMBULANCES, PART I," WHICH HAS
- 13 GENERATED CONCERN AMONG THE EMS COMMUNITY, CITING A POTENTIAL
- 14 INCREASE OF SEVERAL THOUSAND DOLLARS TO THE COST OF AN
- 15 AMBULANCE; AND
- 16 WHEREAS, NFPA 1917 IS SCHEDULED TO BECOME EFFECTIVE FOR NEW
- 17 AMBULANCES PURCHASED OR UNDER CONTRACT FOR PURCHASE ON OR AFTER
- 18 JANUARY 1, 2013; AND
- 19 WHEREAS, THE ASSOCIATION REACHED OUT TO THE EMS COMMUNITY AND
- 20 CREATED A NEW TECHNICAL COMMITTEE CONSISTING OF MORE EMS MEMBERS
- 21 TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROCESS FOR REVIEWING NFPA 1917; AND
- 22 WHEREAS, The association has produced a Pennsylvania Fire <--
- 23 Needs Assessment report in 2001, 2005 and 2011, highlighting the
- 24 needs which remain in Pennsylvania's fire departments, such as
- 25 the existing shortfalls CONTINUES TO CONSIDER STANDARDS for <--
- 26 self-contained breathing apparatus, personal protective
- 27 equipment, training and fire stations and apparatus, FIRE <--
- 28 STATIONS, APPARATUS AND AMBULANCES; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Recognizing these continuing needs THE CONCERNS OF <--
- 30 OUR EMERGENCY PROVIDERS should cause the association to strongly

- 2 the firefighting FIRE AND EMS community; therefore be it
