AN ACT

1 Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, in public safety, providing for
3 violence intervention and prevention; establishing the
4 Community-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention (VIP)
5 Grant Program; imposing duties on the Pennsylvania Commission
6 on Crime and Delinquency; and making appropriations.

7 This act may be referred to as the Break the Cycle of
8 Violence Act.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. Part III of Title 35 of the Pennsylvania
12 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

5 § 5701. Scope of chapter.

6 This chapter relates to violence intervention and prevention.

7 § 5702. Definitions.

8 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
9 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
10 context clearly indicates otherwise:

11 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
12 Delinquency.

13 "Disproportionately impacted by violence." Having any of the
14 following characteristics of a municipality or community:

15 (1) Experiencing 10 or more homicides per year for at
16 least two of the three years preceding the submission of a
17 program grant application.

18 (2) Demonstrating a unique and compelling need for
19 additional resources to address gun and group-related
20 violence within the municipality or community.

21 "Municipality." A city, borough, incorporated town, township
22 or home rule municipality.

23 "Program." The Community-Based Violence Intervention and
24 Prevention (VIP) Grant Program established under section 5703(a)
25 (relating to grant program).

26 § 5703. Grant program.

27 (a) Establishment.--The Community-Based Violence
28 Intervention and Prevention (VIP) Grant Program is established
29 within the commission.

30 (b) Purpose.--The purpose of the program is to award grants

1 to improve public health and safety in municipalities and
2 communities that are disproportionately impacted by violence by
3 supporting, expanding and replicating effective community-based
4 violence reduction initiatives through strategies that:

5 (1) Include, but are not limited to, hospital-based
6 violence intervention, evidence-based street outreach and
7 focused deterrence programs.

8 (2) Have demonstrated effectiveness at reducing gun or
9 group-related violence without contributing to mass
10 incarceration.

11 (3) Are primarily focused on providing community-based
12 violence intervention services to the relatively small number
13 of individuals within a program grantee's municipality or
14 community who are identified as being at the highest risk of
15 perpetrating or being victimized by violence in the near
16 future.

17 (c) Administration.--The commission shall administer the
18 program.

19 (d) Public notice.--The commission shall provide information
20 regarding the availability and award of program grant money on
21 the commission's publicly accessible Internet website.

22 § 5704. Advisory committee.

23 The commission shall form a grant selection advisory
24 committee that includes, but is not limited to, the following:

25 (1) Individuals who have been personally impacted by
26 violence.

27 (2) Individuals with experience implementing community-
28 based violence reduction initiatives.

29 (3) At least three members of the Department of Health's
30 Office of Health Equity Advisory Committee.

1 § 5705. Application forms.

2 The commission shall develop annual grant application forms
3 for any municipality or community-based organization serving a
4 municipality that seeks a program grant. At a minimum, the forms
5 shall contain the following information:

6 (1) The name, address and contact information of the
7 municipality or community-based organization.

8 (2) The amount of program grant money requested.

9 (3) The proposed use for the program grant money
10 requested, including clearly defined and measurable
11 objectives for the program grant money and the anticipated
12 number of individuals to be served.

13 (4) A statement describing how the municipality or
14 community-based organization proposes to use the program
15 grant money to implement a community-based violence reduction
16 initiative in accordance with the strategies described in
17 section 5703(b) (relating to grant program).

18 (5) A statement describing how the municipality or
19 community-based organization proposes to use the program
20 grant money to enhance coordination with relevant
21 stakeholders or existing violence prevention and intervention
22 programs and service providers in the municipality or
23 community, if any, to achieve maximum impact and minimize
24 duplication of services.

25 (6) Evidence indicating that the proposed violence
26 reduction initiative would likely reduce the incidence of gun
27 and group-related violence.

28 (7) Any other information that the commission deems
29 necessary and appropriate.

30 § 5706. Award of program grants.

1 (a) Review.--After review of the information provided under
2 each applicant's submitted application form, the commission
3 shall determine whether to award grant program money to the
4 applicant and, if so, the amount of the program grant money
5 awarded.

6 (b) Competitive nature of awards.--Program grants shall be
7 awarded on a competitive basis to municipalities and community-
8 based organizations that are disproportionately impacted by
9 violence.

10 (c) Considerations.--In awarding program grants, the
11 commission shall:

12 (1) Give preference to applicants whose grant proposals
13 demonstrate the greatest likelihood of reducing the number of
14 persons victimized by gun and group-related violence in their
15 community, without contributing to mass incarceration.

16 (2) Consider the geographic and demographic diversity of
17 the applicants.

18 (3) Consider the scope of the applicant's proposal and
19 the applicant's demonstrated need for additional resources to
20 effectively reduce gun and group-related violence in the
21 affected municipality or community.

22 (d) Cash or in-kind match.--

23 (1) Subject to paragraph (2), each municipality that
24 receives a program grant shall commit a cash or in-kind match
25 that is equivalent to 25% of the cost of the program grant
26 awarded under this chapter.

27 (2) The commission may waive the requirement under
28 paragraph (1) for good cause.

29 (e) Distribution by municipality.--Each municipality that
30 receives a program grant shall distribute at least 50% of the

1 program grant money to:

2 (1) one or more community-based organizations within the
3 municipality or community;

4 (2) a public agency or department that is not a law
5 enforcement agency but is primarily dedicated to community
6 safety or violence prevention within the municipality or
7 community; or

8 (3) a combination of the entities specified under
9 paragraphs (1) and (2).

10 (f) Duration.--Subject to the availability of State funding,
11 a program grant shall be awarded for a duration of at least
12 three years.

13 (g) Notice.--

14 (1) The commission shall provide written notice to the
15 applicant of the award or denial of the program grant money.

16 (2) Notice of the award of program grant money shall
17 include the amount of the program grant money awarded and any
18 conditions or restrictions on the use of the program grant
19 money.

20 (3) Notice of the denial of all or part of the program
21 grant money requested shall include the reasons for the full
22 or partial denial.

23 § 5707. Appropriations.

24 In addition to any amounts otherwise authorized to be
25 appropriated or made available to the commission, the sum of
26 \$10,000,000 is hereby appropriated for each of the three fiscal
27 years following the effective date of this section to provide
28 program grants.

29 § 5708. Administrative costs.

30 The commission may use up to 8% of the money appropriated for

1 program grants each year for the costs of administering the
2 program, which may include the costs relating to the employment
3 of personnel, providing technical assistance to grantees and
4 evaluating the impact of initiatives supported by the grants.
5 § 5709. Reports.

6 Upon completion of each grant cycle, the commission shall
7 prepare and submit a report to the General Assembly regarding
8 the impact of violence reduction initiatives supported by the
9 program.

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
