AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," providing for emergency COVID-19 provisions. 21 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 23 hereby enacts as follows: 24 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 25 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding an 26 article to read:

ARTICLE I-A

1 EMERGENCY COVID-19 PROVISIONS

- 2 Section 101-A. Definitions.
- 3 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 4 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 5 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 6 "Salon." Any of the following:
- 7 (1) A licensed cosmetology salon.
- 8 (2) A licensed salon limited to the practice of
- 9 <u>esthetics, nail technology or natural hair braiding.</u>
- 10 <u>(3) A licensed barber shop.</u>
- 11 <u>Section 102-A. Salon and related products.</u>
- 12 <u>Notwithstanding any other provision of law or executive</u>
- 13 <u>declaration or order, a salon owner or salon employee may sell</u>
- 14 <u>salon and related products for retail pickup at a curbside</u>
- 15 <u>location not more than 100 feet from the salon. The license of a</u>
- 16 salon owner or salon employee operating under this article may
- 17 <u>not be surrendered, revoked or changed as a result of operation</u>
- 18 <u>under this article</u>, except if the salon owner or salon employee
- 19 violates section 103-A.
- 20 Section 103-A. Compliance.
- 21 A salon owner or salon employee operating under this article
- 22 shall adhere to social distancing practices and other mitigation
- 23 measures defined by the Centers for Disease Control and
- 24 Prevention to protect workers and customers and to mitigate the
- 25 spread of the COVID-19 virus.
- 26 Section 104-A. Applicability.
- 27 This article shall apply during the period of the declaration
- 28 of the disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6,
- 29 2020, published in 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), or any
- 30 renewal of the declaration, unless the order removes any of the

- 1 <u>restrictions or otherwise grants greater permissions for salon</u>
- 2 operations than are provided under this article.
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
