AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Providing for financial assistance to stabilize arts organizations and programs and to support community recovery and resiliency through the arts through partnerships among public, private and nonprofit entities; establishing the Arts and Culture Stability and Recovery Fund; and imposing duties on the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Short title.
10	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Support for
11	the Arts Rescue Plan Act.
12	Section 2. Definitions.
13	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
14	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
15	context clearly indicates otherwise:
16	"American Rescue Plan Act of 2021." The American Rescue Plan
17	Act of 2021 (Public Law 117-2, 135 Stat. 4).
18	"CARES Act." The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic
19	Security (CARES) Act (Public Law 116-136, 134 Stat. 281).

"Council." The Pennsylvania Council on the Arts.
 "Eligible applicant." An applicant that has not been
 awarded, in aggregate, \$500,000 or more in any of the following:

4 (1) Relief money from the Shuttered Venue Operators
5 Grant Program administered by the Small Business
6 Administration.

7 (2) Relief money from the COVID-19 Cultural and Museum
8 Preservation Grant Program administered by the Department of
9 Community and Economic Development.

10 (3) A National Endowment for the Arts relief grant
 11 authorized under the CARES Act or American Rescue Plan Act of
 12 2021.

(4) A Mid-Atlantic Arts Foundation relief grant
authorized under the CARES Act or American Rescue Plan Act of
2021.

16 "Fund." The Arts and Culture Stability and Recovery Fund 17 established under section 3.

18 "Low-income community." A population census tract in which 19 any of the following apply:

20 (1) The poverty rate for the tract is at least 20%.

21 (2) As follows:

(i) for a tract not located within a metropolitan
area, the median family income for the tract does not
exceed 80% of Statewide median family income; or

(ii) for a tract located within a metropolitan area,
the median family income for the tract does not exceed
80% of the greater of Statewide median family income or
the metropolitan area median family income.

29 "Other entity designated by the council." A nonprofit
30 organization registered in this Commonwealth which the council

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has used to assist it in carrying out its duties under the act of January 25, 1965 (1966 P.L.1542, No.538), entitled "An act creating a Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, for the encouragement and development of the various arts, and making an appropriation therefor," prior to the effective date of this section.

7 Section 3. Arts and Culture Stability and Recovery Fund.

8 (a) Establishment.--The Arts and Culture Stability and 9 Recovery Fund is established in the State Treasury. The money in 10 the fund is appropriated on a continuing basis to the council 11 for the purpose of ensuring the stability and recovery of this 12 Commonwealth's arts organizations and programs to support 13 community recovery and resiliency through the arts.

14 (b) Sources of fund.--The fund may consist of:

(1) Grants and contributions from private sources.
(2) Appropriations made to the fund by the General
Assembly.

18 (3) Interest on money deposited into the fund.

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(4) The sum transferred under subsection (c).

(c) Interfund transfer.--The sum of \$25,000,000 is transferred from money received under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 in the State Treasury to the fund for the purpose of providing awards under this act.

(d) Administration of fund.--The council may, annually, use or disperse up to 5% of available money in the fund for the administration of this act.

27 Section 4. Powers and duties of council.

(a) Authority.--The council may carry out the duties imposed
by this act, including the development of guidelines and
applications.

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(b) Programs.--The council shall develop programs to carry
 out the purposes of this act.

3 Section 5. Grants to third party entities for arts organizations and arts programs stabilization. 4 Funding.--The amount of \$10,000,000 is transferred from 5 (a) the fund to the council to provide for grants under this 6 7 section. The council shall allocate the amount transferred under 8 this section based on an amount per county and per capita to ensure that adequate support is available across this 9 10 Commonwealth.

(b) Administration.--The grants shall be administered by the council's Pennsylvania Partners in the Arts partners or other entities as designated by the council.

(c) Application.--An eligible applicant may apply to a Pennsylvania Partners in the Arts partner or other entities designated by the council serving the applicant's county of residence. An eligible applicant must be a nonprofit organization registered in this Commonwealth with a history of at least one year of conducting arts activities and services.

(d) Award.--A Pennsylvania Partners in the Arts partner or
other entity designated by the council may award a grant of up
to \$10,000 for operations and programs in support of an
applicant's arts-related missions. The applicant shall not be
required to match all or a portion of the amount of the grant.
Section 6. Direct grants for arts organizations and arts
programs stabilization.

(a) Funding.--The amount of \$10,000,000 is transferred from
the fund to the council to provide for grants under this
section.

30 (b) Administration.--The grants shall be administered by the 20220SB1185PN1612 - 4 - 1 council.

2 (c) Application.--An eligible applicant may apply to the 3 council for a direct grant from the council from any of the 4 following funding programs for the period of September 1, 2021, 5 through August 31, 2023:

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(1) Arts Organizations and Arts Programs track.

7 (2) Entry to Arts Organizations and Arts Programs track.

8 (3) Preserving Diverse Cultures Strategies for Success
9 program, Intermediate or Advanced levels.

10 (d) Award.--The council may award a grant of up to \$25,000 11 for operations and programs in support of an applicant's arts-12 related missions. The applicant shall not be required to match 13 all or a portion of the amount of the grant.

14 Section 7. Community recovery and resiliency through the arts.
15 (a) Funding.--The amount of \$5,000,000 is transferred from
16 the fund to the council to provide for grants under this
17 section.

18 (b) Administration.--The grants shall be administered by the 19 council.

20 (c) Application.--An eligible applicant may apply to the21 council. The following shall be eligible applicants:

(1) An applicant to the council's Creative CommunitiesInitiative.

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(2) A local or county government.

(3) A nonprofit organization formed under the laws ofthis Commonwealth.

27 (d) Award.--

(1) The council may, based on a competitive review
 process, award a grant of up to \$100,000 to support
 partnerships among public, private and nonprofit entities to

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enhance the physical, economic and social character of their 1 2 communities. The applicant shall be required to match a 3 portion of the amount of the grant. 4 (2) Priority shall be given to applications that support activity in any of the following: 5 6 (i) A low-income community. (ii) A county classified as transitional, at risk or 7 distressed on the effective date of this section by the 8 9 Appalachian Regional Commission. Section 8. Effective date. 10

11 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
