- Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania
 Consolidated Statutes, in incentives for municipal volunteers
 of fire companies and nonprofit emergency medical services
 agencies, further providing for definitions, for volunteer
 service credit program, for service record, for certification
 and for duties of State Fire Commissioner.
- 7 Section 1. The definitions of "active volunteer" and
- 8 "volunteer" in section 79A03 of Title 35 of the Pennsylvania
- 9 Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section is amended by
- 10 adding a definition to read:
- 11 § 79A03. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Active volunteer." A volunteer for a volunteer fire company
- 16 [or], nonprofit emergency medical services agency or volunteer
- 17 HAZMAT Team who has complied with the requirements of the
- 18 volunteer service credit program and who is certified under
- 19 section 79A23 (relating to certification).

- 1 "HAZMAT Team." As the term "certified hazardous material
- 2 response team" is defined in section 103 of the act of December
- 3 <u>7, 1990 (P.L.639, No.165), known as the Hazardous Material</u>
- 4 Emergency Planning and Response Act.
- 5 * * *
- 6 "Volunteer." A member of a volunteer fire company [or], a
- 7 nonprofit emergency medical services agency or a volunteer
- 8 HAZMAT Team.
- 9 * * *
- 10 Section 2. Sections 79A21, 79A22, 79A23(a) and (c) and
- 11 79A33(1) of Title 35 are amended to read:
- 12 § 79A21. Volunteer service credit program.
- 13 (a) Establishment. -- The governing body may establish a
- 14 volunteer service credit program that establishes the annual
- 15 requirements for the certification of a volunteer in active
- 16 service at a volunteer fire company [or], a nonprofit emergency
- 17 medical services agency or a volunteer HAZMAT Team.
- 18 (b) Activities. -- The volunteer service credit program shall
- 19 consider the following activities in determining credit toward a
- 20 certification of active service:
- 21 (1) The number of emergency calls to which a volunteer
- responds.
- 23 (2) The level of training and participation in formal
- training and drills for a volunteer.
- 25 (3) The total amount of time expended by a volunteer on
- 26 administrative and other support services, including
- fundraising and facility or equipment maintenance.
- 28 (4) The involvement in other events or projects that aid
- 29 the financial viability, emergency response or operational
- readiness of a volunteer fire company [or], a nonprofit

- 1 emergency medical services agency or a volunteer HAZMAT Team.
- 2 (c) Guidelines.--The governing body shall, with the advice
- 3 of the chief of a volunteer fire company and the supervisor or
- 4 chief of a nonprofit emergency medical services agency or the
- 5 <u>head of the volunteer HAZMAT Team</u> or their designees, adopt
- 6 guidelines, including forms and applications, necessary to
- 7 implement this section.
- 8 (d) Eligibility list. -- A notarized list of eligible active
- 9 volunteers shall be submitted to the governing body, no later
- 10 than 45 days before tax notices are to be distributed, by the
- 11 following:
- 12 (1) The chief of a volunteer fire company, where
- 13 applicable.
- 14 (2) The supervisor or chief of a nonprofit emergency
- 15 medical services agency, where applicable.
- 16 (3) The head of a volunteer HAZMAT Team.
- 17 (e) Exclusion. -- An eligible active volunteer may only
- 18 receive a tax credit under this subchapter once for each
- 19 governing body.
- 20 § 79A22. Service record.
- 21 (a) Log.--The chief of a volunteer fire company [or], the
- 22 supervisor or chief of a nonprofit emergency medical services
- 23 agency or the head of the volunteer HAZMAT Team or their
- 24 designees shall establish and maintain a service log that
- 25 documents the activities of each volunteer that qualify for
- 26 credit toward active service under the volunteer service credit
- 27 program and the calculation of the total credits earned for each
- 28 volunteer in the volunteer fire company [or] nonprofit
- 29 emergency medical services agency or volunteer HAZMAT Team.
- 30 (b) Review.--Service logs established and maintained by

- 1 volunteer fire companies [or], nonprofit emergency medical
- 2 services agencies or volunteer HAZMAT Teams shall be subject to
- 3 periodic review by the commissioner, the Auditor General, the
- 4 governing body where the volunteer fire company [or], nonprofit
- 5 emergency medical services agency or volunteer HAZMAT Team is
- 6 located and the governing body where the volunteer fire company
- 7 [or], nonprofit emergency medical services agency or volunteer
- 8 <u>HAZMAT Team</u> provides services.
- 9 § 79A23. Certification.
- 10 (a) Self-certification. -- The active volunteer shall sign and
- 11 submit an application for certification to the chief of the
- 12 volunteer fire company [or], the supervisor or chief of the
- 13 nonprofit emergency medical services agency or head of the
- 14 volunteer HAZMAT Team where the volunteer serves.
- 15 * * *
- 16 (c) Local sign-off.--The chief and another officer of the
- 17 volunteer fire company [and], the supervisor or chief and
- 18 another officer of the nonprofit emergency medical services
- 19 agency and the head of the volunteer HAZMAT Team shall sign the
- 20 application attesting to the individual's status as an active
- 21 volunteer or that the individual can no longer serve as an
- 22 active volunteer due to injury. The application shall then be
- 23 forwarded to the municipality, as appropriate, for final review
- 24 and processing.
- 25 § 79A33. Duties of State Fire Commissioner.
- 26 The State Fire Commissioner shall:
- 27 (1) Establish guidelines for municipalities, volunteer
- fire companies [and], nonprofit EMS agencies and volunteer
- 29 <u>HAZMAT Teams</u> regarding the tax credit and post the guidelines
- 30 online.

- 2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
