## AN ACT

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| 5                | The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  |
| 6                | hereby enacts as follows:   |
| 7                | Section 1. Title 74 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated  |
| 8                | Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:  |
| 9                | <u>§ 1510.1. State Safety Oversight Office.</u>   |
| 10               | (a) EstablishmentThe State Safety Oversight Office is   |
| 11               | established in the department and shall be under the  |
| 12               | jurisdiction of the secretary. The secretary, in consultation   |
| 13               | with the Federal Transit Administration, shall determine an   |
| 14               | appropriate staffing level for the SSO Office that is   |
| 15               | commensurate with the number, size and complexity of fixed  |
| 16               | guideway public transportation systems in this Commonwealth. The  |
| 17               | SSO Office shall adhere to and have the authority and capability  |
| 18               | to perform and enforce the provisions and functions specified   |
| 19               | under this section, 49 U.S.C. § 5329 (relating to public  |

| 1  | transportation safety program) and the associated Federal        |
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| 2  | regulations set forth and adopted for oversight for each fixed   |
| 3  | guideway public transportation system.                           |
| 4  | (b) Program standardThe SSO Office shall establish,              |
| 5  | adopt, administer and enforce the SSO program standard. The SSO  |
| 6  | Office shall annually review and consult with each fixed         |
| 7  | guideway public transportation system that the SSO Office        |
| 8  | oversees in the development of the SSO program standard. The     |
| 9  | consultation under this subsection must demonstrate that the SSO |
| 10 | Office has taken each fixed guideway public transportation       |
| 11 | system's comments, concerns and feedback under good faith        |
| 12 | consideration in further adopting, implementing and maintaining  |
| 13 | the SSO program standard.  |
| 14 | (c) Risk-based inspections, investigations, audits, testing      |
| 15 | and other oversight activities                                   |
| 16 | (1) The SSO Office shall conduct risk-based inspections,         |
| 17 | investigations, audits and other oversight activities at each    |
| 18 | fixed guideway public transportation system.                     |
| 19 | (2) In carrying out the requirements under this                  |
| 20 | subsection, the SSO Office shall enter the facilities of each    |
| 21 | fixed guideway public transportation system, either              |
| 22 | physically or virtually, to inspect infrastructure,              |
| 23 | equipment, records, personnel and data, including the data       |
| 24 | that the fixed guideway public transportation system collects    |
| 25 | when identifying and evaluating safety risks and safety          |
| 26 | events, with or without advanced notice to the fixed guideway    |
| 27 | public transportation system.                                    |
| 28 | (3) The SSO Office shall establish in the SSO program            |
| 29 | standard policies specifying the qualifications of               |
| 30 | inspectors, protocol for inspecting public and nonpublic         |

| 4    | (d) Failure to complyIf a fixed guideway public                  |  |
| 5    | transportation system fails to comply with relevant safety-      |  |
| 6    | related Federal and State laws and the SSO program standard, the |  |
| 7    | <u>SSO Office may:</u>   |  |
| 8    | (1) Issue a safety directive requiring the fixed                 |  |
| 9    | guideway public transportation system to correct the safety      |  |
| 10   | deficiency.  |  |
| 11   | (2) Require the prioritization and utilization of State          |  |
| 12   | funding to correct the safety deficiency.                        |  |
| 13   | (3) Issue temporary orders to reduce or stop service of          |  |
| 14   | the fixed guideway public transportation system.                 |  |
| 15   | <u>(e) Enforcement actionIn response to an imminent threat</u>   |  |
| 16   | to the safety of fixed guideway public transportation system     |  |
| 17   | employees or the general public by an unacceptable hazardous     |  |
| 18   | condition, the SSO Office shall issue and enforce temporary      |  |
| 19   | actions or directives to the fixed guideway public               |  |
| 20   | transportation system.   |  |
| 21   | (f) OversightThe SSO Office shall oversee a fixed                |  |
| 22   | guideway public transportation system's execution of security    |  |
| 23   | assessments and mitigations as described in the fixed guideway   |  |
| 24   | public transportation system's security and emergency            |  |
| 25   | preparedness plan and in safety and security certification       |  |
| 26   | processes for new capital projects being developed and           |  |
| 27   | constructed by the fixed guideway public transportation system   |  |
| 28   | to the extent that the oversight activities do not conflict with |  |
| 29   | requirements developed by the Transportation Security            |  |
| 30   | Administration under the United States Department of Homeland    |  |

| 2  | (g) ConfidentialityData and reports generated by or             |
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| 3  | submitted to the SSO Office and not made publicly available     |
| 4  | under this section and pertaining to security of a rail-fixed   |
| 5  | guideway public transportation system or its passenger          |
| 6  | <u>operations, are not:</u>                                     |
| 7  | (1) Subject to access under the act of February 14, 2008        |
| 8  | (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law.                  |
| 9  | (2) Discoverable or admissible as evidence in any legal         |
| 10 | action or other proceeding for damages.                         |
| 11 | (h) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following           |
| 12 | words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this |
| 13 | subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:      |
| 14 | "Fixed guideway nonrail public transportation system." As       |
| 15 | follows:  |
| 16 | (1) Any of the following:                                       |
| 17 | (i) Route 103 Busway operated by the transportation             |
| 18 | authority of the metropolitan area as defined in section        |
| 19 | <u>1701 (relating to definitions).</u>                          |
| 20 | (ii) Martin Luther King, Jr., East Busway operated              |
| 21 | by the local transportation organization organized and          |
| 22 | existing under the act of April 6, 1956 (1955 P.L.1414,         |
| 23 | No.465), known as the Second Class County Port Authority        |
| 24 | <u>Act.</u>   |
| 25 | (iii) South Busway operated by the local                        |
| 26 | transportation organization organized and existing under        |
| 27 | the Second Class County Port Authority Act.                     |
| 28 | (iv) West Busway operated by the local                          |
| 29 | transportation organization organized and existing under        |
| 30 | the Second Class County Port Authority Act.                     |

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| 1  | (v) Other busways designed and constructed by the               |  |
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| 2  | transportation authority of the metropolitan area as            |  |
| 3  | defined under section 1701 or the local transportation          |  |
| 4  | organization organized and existing under the Second            |  |
| 5  | <u>Class County Port Authority Act that meet the definition</u> |  |
| 6  | of a "bus rapid transit" system as defined by the               |  |
| 7  | National Transit Database and which operates on a fixed         |  |
| 8  | guideway.   |  |
| 9  | (2) Any other busway project that has entered the               |  |
| 10 | preliminary engineering phase.                                  |  |
| 11 | "Fixed guideway public transportation system." Fixed            |  |
| 12 | guideway nonrail public transportation systems and rail-fixed   |  |
| 13 | guideway public transportation systems.                         |  |
| 14 | "Rail-fixed guideway public transportation system." As          |  |
| 15 | <u>follows:</u>   |  |
| 16 | (1) A fixed guideway system that:                               |  |
| 17 | <u>(i) Uses rail.</u>   |  |
| 18 | (ii) Is operated for public transportation.                     |  |
| 19 | (iii) Is operated within this Commonwealth.                     |  |
| 20 | (iv) Is not subject to the jurisdiction of the                  |  |
| 21 | Federal Railroad Administration.                                |  |
| 22 | (2) Any system described under paragraph (1) that is in         |  |
| 23 | the engineering or construction phase.                          |  |
| 24 | "Safety and security certification." A series of processes      |  |
| 25 | that collectively verify the safety and security readiness      |  |
| 26 | associated with a capital project.                              |  |
| 27 | "Security and emergency preparedness plan." A document          |  |
| 28 | developed and adopted by a rail-fixed guideway public           |  |
| 29 | transportation system describing security and emergency         |  |
| 30 | preparedness policies, objectives, responsibilities and         |  |
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| 1 | procedures. |  |
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| 2 | "SSO Office." The State Safety Oversight Office established    |
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| 3 | under this section.  |
| 4 | "SSO program standard." A document established and enforced    |
| 5 | by the SSO Office that identifies the processes and procedures |
| 6 | that govern the activities of the SSO Office and includes      |
| 7 | minimum safety standards, policies and procedures that meet    |
| 8 | Federal requirements for fixed guideway public transportation  |
| 9 | systems within the SSO Office's oversight jurisdiction.        |

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
