AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 21 determined," in administrative organization, further providing for department heads, for gubernatorial 22 appointments and for deputies. 23 24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 25 hereby enacts as follows: 26 Section 1. Sections 206 introductory paragraph, 207.1(f) and 27 213 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The
- 29 Section 206. Department Heads.--[Each] Except as provided in

Administrative Code of 1929, are amended to read:

- 1 <u>section 213 of this act, each</u> administrative department shall
- 2 have as its head an officer who shall, either personally, by
- 3 deputy, or by the duly authorized agent or employe of the
- 4 department, and subject at all times to the provisions of this
- 5 act, exercise the powers and perform the duties by law vested in
- 6 and imposed upon the department.
- 7 * * *
- 8 Section 207.1. Gubernatorial Appointments.--* * *
- 9 (f) A person, other than one serving until a successor is
- 10 appointed and qualified, nominated by the Governor to a position
- 11 for which Senate confirmation is required by this section shall
- 12 not serve in such position nor receive any compensation for
- 13 serving in such position until he has been confirmed by action
- 14 of the Senate or by its inaction as provided by the Constitution
- 15 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and his appointment or
- 16 commission thereafter issued by the Governor: Provided, however,
- 17 That nothing contained in this section shall be construed to
- 18 repeal or modify section 213 of this act: And provided further,
- 19 That, subject to section 213 of this act, nothing in this act
- 20 shall affect the right of an incumbent, whose term of office has
- 21 expired, to continue in his office until his successor is
- 22 appointed and qualified.
- 23 * * *
- 24 Section 213. Deputies. -- The Governor shall appoint and fix
- 25 the compensation of such number of deputy heads of
- 26 administrative departments, except those of the Department of
- 27 Auditor General and Treasury Department, as the Executive Board
- 28 shall approve, who shall, in the absence of the head of such
- 29 department, have the right to exercise all the powers and
- 30 perform all the duties by law vested in and imposed upon the

- 1 head of such department, except the power to appoint bureau or
- 2 division chiefs, or other assistants or employes, and who may,
- 3 at any time, exercise such of the powers and perform such of the
- 4 duties of the head of his department as may be prescribed by the
- 5 head of his department: Provided, however, That any such deputy
- 6 shall not have the right to exercise any power or perform any
- 7 duty which the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 requires the head of his department personally to exercise or
- 9 perform.
- 10 Whenever there shall be a vacancy in the office of the head
- 11 of any department, such deputy as the Governor shall designate
- 12 in writing shall exercise the powers and perform the duties of
- 13 the head of the department until the vacancy is filled[.], as
- 14 follows:
- 15 (1) No designation shall be effective for greater than
- 16 ninety (90) days.
- 17 (2) During the period of designation, the deputy shall have
- 18 <u>the title "Deputy Head of Department."</u>
- 19 (3) No deputy may continue as "Deputy Head of Department"
- 20 after the expiration of the period in paragraph (1).
- 21 (4) No individual may be designated as deputy more than once
- 22 by the same Governor.
- 23 (5) No designated deputy may receive salary, compensation or
- 24 <u>emoluments which exceeds the highest salary, compensation or</u>
- 25 emoluments received by a nondesignated deputy.
- 26 (6) No designated deputy shall receive any increase in
- 27 <u>salary, compensation or emoluments during the period of</u>
- 28 <u>designation or as a result of designation.</u>
- 29 (7) A designated deputy shall, upon request of either the
- 30 Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the Appropriations

- 1 Committee of the House of Representatives, appear at a hearing
- 2 <u>of either committee concerning the Federal or State</u>
- 3 appropriations to the department or the budget request of the
- 4 <u>department.</u>
- 5 <u>In addition to a designated deputy under paragraph (7), a</u>
- 6 person nominated by the Governor to a position as the head of
- 7 any department shall, during the period which the nomination is
- 8 under consideration by the Senate under section 8(b) of Article
- 9 IV of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, upon request of either
- 10 the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the Appropriations
- 11 Committee of the House of Representatives, appear at a hearing
- 12 <u>of either committee concerning the Federal or State</u>
- 13 appropriations to the department or the budget request of the
- 14 <u>department</u>.
- With the approval of the Governor in writing, the head of any
- 16 department may authorize a named deputy to serve in his stead on
- 17 any board or commission, except the Board of Pardons of which
- 18 such department head is a member ex-officio. One of the Deputy
- 19 Adjutants General shall possess the same qualifications in all
- 20 respects as are required by law for the Adjutant General of the
- 21 Department of Military Affairs.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
