AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled
"An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the
executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
Executive Department thereof and the administrative
departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
officers, and of the several administrative departments,
boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and
prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation
of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of
certain departments, boards and commissions shall be
determined," establishing the Commonwealth Housing Council;
and providing for duties of council.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding an
article to read:

1	ARTICLE XXVIII-J
2	COMMONWEALTH HOUSING COUNCIL
3	Section 2801-J. Scope of article.
4	This article establishes the Commonwealth Housing Council.
5	Section 2802-J. Definitions.
6	The following words and phrases when used in this article
7	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
8	context clearly indicates otherwise:
9	"Council." The Commonwealth Housing Council established
10	<u>under section 2803-J.</u>
11	Section 2803-J. Establishment of council.
12	The Commonwealth Housing Council is established.
13	Section 2804-J. Purpose of council.
14	The council shall coordinate with executive departments and
15	agencies regarding the Commonwealth's housing policies.
16	Section 2805-J. Membership of council.
17	The council shall consist of the following members:
18	(1) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development
19	<u>or a designee.</u>
20	(2) The Secretary of Human Services or a designee.
21	(3) The Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Housing
22	<u>Finance Agency or a designee.</u>
23	(4) The Secretary of the Budget or a designee.
24	(5) A member of the Senate appointed by the President
25	pro tempore of the Senate.
26	(6) A member of the Senate appointed by the Minority
27	Leader of the Senate.
28	(7) A member of the House of Representatives appointed
29	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
30	(8) A member of the House of Representatives appointed

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1	by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
2	(9) The mayor of a city of the first class or a designee
3	with experience in housing.
4	(10) The county executive of a county of the second
5	class or a designee with experience in housing.
6	(11) One member representing county government with
7	experience in housing appointed by the Governor from a list
8	of 16 individuals provided by the county commissioners or
9	county executives of Adams, Berks, Centre, Cumberland,
10	<u>Dauphin, Fulton, Franklin, Huntingdon, Juniata, Lancaster,</u>
11	Lebanon, Mifflin, Perry, Snyder, Union and York Counties.
12	(12) One member of county government with experience in
13	housing appointed by the Governor from a list of 18
14	individuals provided by the county commissioners or county
15	executives of Bradford, Carbon, Clinton, Columbia,
16	Lackawanna, Luzerne, Lycoming, Monroe, Montour,
17	Northumberland, Pike, Potter, Schuylkill, Sullivan,
18	Susquehanna, Tioga, Wayne and Wyoming Counties.
19	(13) One member of county government with experience in
20	housing appointed by the Governor from a list of six
21	individuals provided by the county commissioners or county
22	executives of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Lehigh, Montgomery
23	and Northampton Counties.
24	(14) One member of county government with experience in
25	housing appointed by the Governor from a list of 13
26	individuals provided by the county commissioners or county
27	executives of Armstrong, Cameron, Clarion, Clearfield,
28	<u>Crawford, Elk, Erie, Forest, Jefferson, McKean, Mercer,</u>
29	Venango and Warren Counties.
30	(15) One member of county government with experience in

1	housing appointed by the Governor from a list of 12
2	individuals provided by the county commissioners or county
3	executives of Beaver, Bedford, Blair, Butler, Cambria,
4	Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence, Somerset, Washington and
5	Westmoreland Counties.
6	Section 2806-J. Administration of council.
7	(a) OrganizationThe Governor shall select a member of the
8	council to serve as chairperson. The members of the council
9	shall select from among themselves any other officers as the
10	<u>council deems necessary.</u>
11	(b) QuorumA majority of the members of the council shall
12	constitute a quorum. A majority of the members of the council
13	shall be necessary to take an action of the council. The number
14	required for a majority of the members of the council under this
15	subsection shall be reduced if there is a vacancy on the
16	<u>council.</u>
17	(c) MeetingsThe council shall hold its first meeting
18	within 90 days of the effective date of this subsection. The
19	council shall meet no less than once a quarter.
20	(d) Initial appointments and vacancies
21	(1) An appointing authority under section 2805-J shall
22	appoint initial members to the council within 60 days of the
23	effective date of this subsection.
24	(2) A member of the council shall serve a term of three
25	years and may be reappointed for no more than two consecutive
26	terms.
27	(3) A member of the council appointed under section
28	<u>2805-J(1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7) and (8) shall serve a</u>
29	term concurrent with the appointing authority.
30	(4) If a vacancy occurs on the council, the designating

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1	or appointing authority shall fill the vacancy in accordance
2	with section 2805-J.
3	(e) Administrative supportThe Office of the Budget shall
4	provide administrative services and staff to the council.
5	(f) CompensationThe members of the council shall not
6	receive compensation for service on the council.
7	(g) CooperationEach executive department or agency shall
8	cooperate with the council in fulfilling the council's duties
9	<u>under section 2807-J.</u>
10	Section 2807-J. Duties of council.
11	(a) Housing strategiesThe council shall develop the
12	Commonwealth's comprehensive housing strategy that may be used
13	by executive departments or agencies.
14	(b) DutiesThe council shall have the following duties:
15	(1) Developing a unified set of housing-related goals
16	and priorities that serve as a framework for executive
17	departments or agencies in the development of housing plans.
18	(2) Working in collaboration with executive departments
19	or agencies to develop a uniform set of housing goals,
20	benchmarks and priorities for this Commonwealth that
21	coordinate and complement Federal and State funding to
22	maximize the availability of housing throughout this
23	Commonwealth.
24	(3) Developing and updating a State plan no less than
25	once every five years for the following purposes:
26	(i) Preserving rental and homeownership affordable
27	units.
28	(ii) Building new affordable units.
29	(iii) Housing for the homeless, seniors, veterans,
30	individuals with disabilities and other disadvantaged

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1	groups.
2	(iv) Housing stability programs and services.
3	(v) Strategies for expanding access to housing.
4	(4) Creating and maintaining a consolidated inventory
5	and resource guide for housing programs and services provided
6	by executive departments or agencies.
7	(5) Implementing national best practices research that
8	may be relevant to this Commonwealth and seeking to benchmark
9	the Commonwealth's housing programs and outcomes against
10	other states.
11	(6) Conducting research or collecting data relating to
12	the needs, demands and conditions of affordable and workforce
13	housing and access to affordable and workforce housing.
14	(7) Ensuring the Commonwealth's comprehensive housing
15	strategy is developed with the consideration for the needs of
16	rural, suburban and urban areas in this Commonwealth and
17	provides the greatest access to safe and affordable housing
18	throughout this Commonwealth.
19	(8) Serving as a coordinating resource to ensure that
20	executive departments or agencies are communicating and
21	coordinating effectively in order to maximize the collective
22	impact of their work regarding the Commonwealth's
23	comprehensive housing strategy.
24	(9) Working in collaboration with executive departments
25	or agencies to advance the Commonwealth's comprehensive
26	housing strategies.
27	(10) Providing regular updates to the Governor, the
28	executive departments or agencies and the General Assembly
29	about the Commonwealth's long-term and short-term housing
30	goals.

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- 1 (c) Access to work of council.--The council shall provide
- 2 information about the council's work to the Governor and the
- 3 General Assembly and post any relevant information, including
- 4 the council's State plan under subsection (b)(3), on a publicly
- 5 <u>accessible Internet website.</u>
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
