AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in miscellaneous provisions,
- establishing the Veterans Mental Health Services Program.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 14 § 9901. Scope of chapter.
- This chapter relates to providing mental health care for
- 16 veterans who have exhausted their Federal benefits or are in
- 17 acute crisis.

- 1 § 9902. Definitions.
- 2 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 3 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 4 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 5 <u>"Acute crisis." When an individual is in need of immediate</u>
- 6 mental health care to protect the safety and well-being of the
- 7 individual or the public.
- 8 "Department." The Department of Military and Veterans
- 9 Affairs of the Commonwealth.
- 10 <u>"Eliqible veteran."</u> An individual who served in the United
- 11 States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or the
- 12 National Guard, and who meets the requirements under section
- 13 9903(e) (relating to Veterans Mental Health Services Program).
- "Health care provider." As defined in 45 CFR 160.103
- 15 <u>(relating to definitions)</u>, as of the effective date of this
- 16 <u>definition</u>.
- 17 "Participating health care provider." A health care provider
- 18 who provides mental health services to veterans under the
- 19 program.
- 20 "Program." The Veterans Mental Health Services Program
- 21 established under section 9903(a).
- 22 "Treatment." As defined in 45 CFR 164.501 (relating to
- 23 definitions).
- "Veterans Administration." The United States Veterans
- 25 Administration.
- 26 § 9903. Veterans Mental Health Services Program.
- 27 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Veterans Mental Health Services</u>
- 28 Program is established within the department to provide mental
- 29 health care to veterans.
- 30 (b) Reimbursement. -- The department shall reimburse health

1	care providers who participate in the program. The following
2	<pre>shall apply:</pre>
3	(1) An eligible veteran may receive five reimbursed
4	sessions per year.
5	(2) The department may grant an eligible veteran
6	additional sessions if determined by the health care provider
7	that the sessions are necessary and the department has:
8	(i) the resources necessary to reimburse the health
9	care provider; and
10	(ii) approved the additional sessions before they
11	occur.
12	(c) Program guidelines In consultation with the Department
13	of Human Services, the department shall determine program
14	guidelines for eligible veterans and health care providers.
15	(d) List of participating providers The department shall
16	publish on the department's publicly accessible Internet website
17	a list of participating health care providers.
18	(e) Eligibility requirements In order to be eligible to
19	participate in the program, the following must apply to the
20	<pre>veteran:</pre>
21	(1) The veteran was discharged or released from service
22	under conditions other than dishonorable.
23	(2) Either of the following:
24	(i) The veteran's benefits related to mental health
25	services provided by the Veterans Administration have
26	been exhausted for the year in which the veteran seeks to
27	participate in the program.
28	(ii) The veteran is in acute crisis.
29	(f) Declaration form The department shall prescribe and
30	provide participating health care providers with a form on which

- 1 the eligible veteran shall declare that the eligible veteran has
- 2 complied with the requirement under subsection (e)(2)(i), if
- 3 applicable.
- 4 (g) Treatment requirements. -- Prior to treatment, an eliqible
- 5 <u>veteran shall provide the participating health care provider</u>
- 6 <u>with:</u>
- 7 (1) a valid identification card that:
- 8 <u>(i) clearly indicates that the individual is a</u>
- 9 <u>veteran of the United States Armed Forces; and</u>
- 10 <u>(ii) includes a photo of the veteran.</u>
- 11 (2) The completed form required under subsection (f).
- 12 <u>(h) Report.--</u>
- 13 (1) No later than December 31 of each year, the
- department shall deliver a report regarding the program,
- including, but not limited to, the number of:
- (i) eligible veterans participating in the program
- per county;
- 18 (ii) health care providers participating in the
- 19 <u>program per county;</u> and
- 20 (iii) mental health care sessions provided by the
- 21 program per county.
- 22 (2) The report under paragraph (1) shall be submitted to
- 23 the following:
- (i) The President pro tempore of the Senate.
- 25 (ii) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 26 (iii) The chairperson and minority chairperson of
- 27 the Appropriations Committee of the Senate.
- 28 (iv) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 29 Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 30 (v) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the

1	Health and Human Services Committee of the Senate.
2	(vi) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
3	Human Services Committee of the House of Representatives.
4	(vii) The chairperson and minority chairperson of
5	the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee
6	of the Senate.
7	(viii) The chairperson and minority chairperson of
8	the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee
9	of the House of Representatives.
0	Section 2 This act shall take effect in 120 days
