## A RESOLUTION

Designating Wednesday, May 8, 2013, as "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Awareness Day."
WHEREAS, Health care costs represent 17.6% of Gross Domestic
Product (GDP) nationally; and
WHEREAS, Seventy percent of health care transactions are
paper based; and
WHEREAS, The health care industry invests only 5% of revenue
on information technology and management systems versus 10.5 $\%$ of
other data-intensive industries such as banking; and
WHEREAS, The United States spends more than \$2.6 trillion on
health care a year or 17.6% of our nation's Gross Domestic
Product (GDP), yet some of that spending is unnecessary and
spent on clinical and administrative waste, theft and excess
costs; and
WHEREAS, Spending on health care has risen over 40% in the
last decade; and
WHEREAS, In Pennsylvania, medical assistance/Medicaid

1 spending in 2010 was \$18.7 billion; and

2 WHEREAS, A study by the Commonwealth Fund has demonstrated 3 that the use of automated clinical decision support systems can 4 result in the net reduction of \$538 per patient per hospital 5 stay; and

WHEREAS, The Institute of Medicine reports there are at least 6 7 1.5 million preventable adverse drug events per year, each 8 adding more than \$8,700 to the cost of a hospital stay; and 9 WHEREAS, The American Hospital Association reports that 10 Pennsylvania's hospitals and health systems are outpacing hospitals nationally in their adoption and use of clinical 11 information technology and information management systems; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Health care providers in this Commonwealth report an improved ability to recruit physicians coming out of medical 14 15 school when advanced information technology is employed at their 16 sites; and

WHEREAS, In 2012, Senate Bill No. 8 was signed into law, enacting the Pennsylvania eHealth Information Technology Act and establishing the Pennsylvania eHealth Partnership Authority and a health information exchange; therefore be it

21 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate Wednesday, May 8, 2013, 22 as "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Awareness 23 Day"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the importance of raising awareness of health care information technology and the vital role it will play in helping to save lives and reduce the cost of health care for all Pennsylvanians; and be it further RESOLVED, That the Senate welcome friends, supporters and members of the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS) on their visit to the State Capitol to promote
