A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the month of October 2023 as "National Principals
2 Month" in Pennsylvania and honoring the contributions that
3 principals make in the elementary schools, middle schools and
4 high schools of our nation.

5 WHEREAS, The National Association of Secondary School
6 Principals and the National Association of Elementary School
7 Principals have declared the month of October 2023 as "National
8 Principals Month"; and

9 WHEREAS, Principals are educational visionaries,
10 instructional and assessment leaders, community builders, budget
11 analysts, facilities managers and administrators of legal and
12 contractual obligations; and

13 WHEREAS, Principals work collaboratively with teachers and
14 parents to develop and implement a clear mission and high
15 curriculum standards and performance goals; and

16 WHEREAS, Principals create school environments that
17 facilitate great teaching and learning and continuous school
18 improvement; and

1 WHEREAS, The vision, actions and dedication of principals
2 provide a mobilizing force behind any school reform effort; and

3 WHEREAS, During the 2022-2023 school year, there were
4 approximately 5,000 principals in this Commonwealth; and

5 WHEREAS, The celebration of "National Principals Month"
6 honors elementary school, middle school and high school
7 principals and recognizes the importance of principals in
8 ensuring that every child has access to a high-quality
9 education; therefore be it

10 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of October 2023
11 as "National Principals Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it
12 further

13 RESOLVED, That the Senate support the goals and ideals of
14 "National Principals Month" and honor the contributions
15 principals make in elementary schools, middle schools and high
16 schools.
