## A RESOLUTION

Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a study on the effect of workforce shortages on State supported Medicaid home and community-based services waiver 3 programs, Pennsylvania Lottery funded area agency on aging 4 programs and Act 150 services in this Commonwealth. 5 6 WHEREAS, Widespread workforce shortages are the biggest challenges facing State Medicaid home and community-based 7 service (HCBS) programs and the Pennsylvania Lottery funded 8 OPTIONS program; and 10 WHEREAS, Widespread workforce shortages were greatly 11 amplified by the COVID-19 pandemic; and 12 WHEREAS, State officials have reported shortages of all types of HCBS providers, including home health aides, personal care 13 attendants, direct support professionals, older adult daily 14 15 living center providers and community-based mental health 16 providers; and 17 WHEREAS, The impact of this reduced direct-care staffing is reverberating through the health care system; and 18 19 WHEREAS, Hospitals have reported that they are delaying

- 1 patient discharges to post-acute settings because long-term care
- 2 facilities and HCBS providers have insufficient staff to accept
- 3 patients for their next stage of care; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Low wages, inconsistent training requirements,
- 5 limited training opportunities and inadequate career advancement
- 6 pathways have historically dissuaded individuals from pursuing
- 7 and retaining jobs as direct care workers; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Medicaid paid for about two-thirds of all HCBS in
- 9 2020; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Statewide more than 140,000 people are served by
- 11 this Commonwealth's Medicaid HCBS, Pennsylvania Lottery funded
- 12 area agency on aging programs and Act 150 services; therefore be
- 13 it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Legislative Budget and
- 15 Finance Committee to conduct a study on the effect of workforce
- 16 shortages on State supported Medicaid home and community-based
- 17 services waiver programs, Pennsylvania Lottery funded area
- 18 agency on aging programs and Act 150 services in this
- 19 Commonwealth, including all of the following:
- 20 (1) Wage rates for home health aides, personal care
- 21 attendants, direct support professionals, older adult daily
- living center providers and community-based mental health
- 23 providers in the HCBS system.
- 24 (2) Rates charged by contract staffing agencies that
- 25 provide HCBS workers.
- 26 (3) The increase in wages paid to HCBS providers and
- 27 direct care staff from 2018 through today using the latest
- 28 available figures.
- 29 (4) The increase in wages paid to contract HCBS
- 30 providers and direct care staff from 2018 through today using

- 1 the latest available figures.
- 2 (5) The increase in wages paid to HCBS providers and 3 direct care staff as compared to the nation's inflation rate 4 over the same time period.
- 5 (6) The increase in wages paid to contract HCBS
  6 providers and direct care staff as compared to the nation's
  7 inflation rate over the same time period.
- 8 (7) Whether HCBS providers needed to increase staffing 9 levels during the same time period.
- 10 (8) The ratio of home health aides, personal care
  11 attendants, direct care workers, direct support
  12 professionals, adult daily living center providers,
  13 community-based mental health providers and direct care staff
  14 working in the programs from 2018 to today using the latest
  15 available figures.
  - (9) Whether current medical assistance program reimbursement rates and funding for the area agencies on aging programs impact the recruitment and retention of the HCBS workforce and what level of funding would be required to ensure a qualified and sustainable workforce.
- 21 (10) Whether HCBS providers experienced an increase in 22 need for staff members with specific expertise or
- 23 certification;

- 25 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 26 issue a report of its findings, along with any statutory or
- 27 regulatory recommendations, to the General Assembly within 12
- 28 months of the adoption of this resolution.
