A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of October 2023 as "National Chiropractic Health Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Approximately 20% of adults in the United States, or
- 4 one in five, experience chronic pain, which is pain lasting more
- 5 than three months; and
- 6 WHEREAS, New cases of chronic pain occur more frequently
- 7 among adults than new cases of other common chronic conditions
- 8 such as diabetes and high blood pressure; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In the United States, musculoskeletal conditions, a
- 10 common cause of chronic pain, result in more than 130 million
- 11 health care visits annually, making them the primary reason
- 12 people visit their doctors; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Low back pain, which ranks among the most common
- 14 forms of chronic pain, has been one of the leading reasons why
- 15 people are prescribed opioids; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The number of people worldwide living with back pain
- 17 is projected to reach 843 million over the next 30 years, an

- 1 increase of 36%; and
- 2 WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and
- 3 Prevention (CDC), one in four patients who receive prescription
- 4 opioids long term for noncancer pain struggle with addiction;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, The American College of Physicians low back pain
- 7 treatment guidelines promote the use of noninvasive, drug-free
- 8 approaches such as spinal manipulation as a first line of
- 9 defense against back pain before the use of pain medications and
- 10 surgery; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The CDC's 2022 Clinical Practice Guideline for
- 12 Prescribing Opioids promotes diverse approaches and varied pain
- 13 management solutions and specifically encourages use of opioid-
- 14 free and nonpharmacologic therapies as a first line of treatment
- 15 against subacute and chronic pain; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Doctors of chiropractic play a key role in helping
- 17 patients manage pain and lessen their reliance on prescription
- 18 pain medications with their evidence-based, patient-centered and
- 19 drug-free approach; and
- 20 WHEREAS, With the theme "Chiropractic: Relieve, Restore,
- 21 Resume" for 2023, "National Chiropractic Health Month" reminds
- 22 people that drug-free treatments for low back, neck and joint
- 23 pain, such as spinal manipulation and other chiropractic
- 24 services, can help relieve pain and restore joint function,
- 25 helping people to resume their lives and the activities that
- 26 matter most; therefore be it
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Senate, in support of the American
- 28 Chiropractic Association, recognize the month of October 2023 as
- 29 "National Chiropractic Health Month" in Pennsylvania.
