## A RESOLUTION

- Designating February 7, 2020, as "National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and
- 4 Prevention, HIV/AIDS affect African Americans at alarming rates;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Of all the racial and ethnic groups within the
- 7 United States, African Americans are the most affected by
- 8 HIV/AIDS; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In 2018, African Americans comprised only 13% of the
- 10 United States population but accounted for 53% of all new HIV
- 11 infections; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 2018, African-American males were diagnosed with
- 13 AIDS approximately 7.8 times the rate as Caucasian males, and
- 14 African-American males are 7 times more likely to die from
- 15 HIV/AIDS than non-Hispanic Caucasian males; and
- 16 WHEREAS, In 2018, African-American females were diagnosed
- 17 with AIDS 16 times the rate as Caucasian females, and African-

- 1 American females are 15 times more likely to die from HIV/AIDS
- 2 than non-Hispanic Caucasian females; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In 2018, African Americans were 8.6 times more
- 4 likely to be diagnosed with HIV infection, as compared to the
- 5 Caucasian population; and
- 6 WHEREAS, "National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day" seeks to
- 7 educate African Americans about this devastating disease through
- 8 a platform emphasizing four main points which include education,
- 9 testing, involvement and treatment; and
- 10 WHEREAS, "National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day" began in
- 11 2000 as five organizations worked collectively to assist in the
- 12 effort to decrease and ultimately eradicate HIV/AIDS in the
- 13 African-American community; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The five organizations included: Concerned Black
- 15 Men, Inc., of Philadelphia, Health Watch Information and
- 16 Promotion Services, Inc., Jackson State University Mississippi
- 17 Urban Research Center, the National Black Alcoholism and
- 18 Addictions Council and the National Black Leadership Commission
- 19 on AIDS, Inc.; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Healthy Black Communities, Inc., known as HBC, is
- 21 serving as the leading organization ensuring the initiative is
- 22 carried out annually; and
- 23 WHEREAS, HBC maintains an active Internet presence promoting
- 24 awareness of the importance of educating communities on the
- 25 effects of HIV/AIDS; and
- 26 WHEREAS, It is imperative that African Americans educate
- 27 themselves and their communities on the effects of HIV/AIDS; and
- 28 WHEREAS, African Americans should be tested to learn their
- 29 HIV/AIDS status because education and early detection are
- 30 critical in saving lives; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate February 7, 2020, as
- 2 "National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania; and be
- 3 it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate annually recognize "National Black
- 5 HIV/AIDS Awareness Day" to increase education, promote inclusion
- 6 and emphasize the importance of testing and HIV/AIDS treatment.
