A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of June 2024 as "Migraine and Headache 2 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Migraines and headache disorders are a genetic,
- 4 neurovascular disease characterized by episodes called attacks;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, According to the World Health Organization, more
- 7 than 40 million people in the United States have migraine and
- 8 headache disorders, and in 2021, 40% of the population, or 3.1
- 9 billion people, were affected; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Headache disorders were globally found to be the
- 11 third leading cause of disability adjusted life years behind
- 12 stroke and dementia; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Attacks are often accompanied by one or more
- 14 symptoms, including visual disturbances, nausea, vomiting,
- 15 dizziness and tingling or numbness in the extremities or face,
- 16 and more than 90% of sufferers are unable to work or function
- 17 normally during their migraine; and

- 1 WHEREAS, These debilitating issues affect 16% of all veterans
- 2 receiving care in the Veterans Health Administration (VHA); and
- 3 WHEREAS, From October 1, 2007, to September 30, 2022, almost
- 4 1.9 million veterans were diagnosed and treated within the VHA
- 5 for migraines and headaches; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Between 2008 and 2022, there was a 122% increase in
- 7 the number of veterans using Veterans Affairs Medical Centers
- 8 for headache care; and
- 9 WHEREAS, An estimated 350,000 service members have headaches
- 10 resulting from traumatic brain injuries sustained in combat; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The impact of migraines, headaches and cluster
- 12 attacks varies widely, showing distinct differences in how often
- 13 the attacks occur, the severity and the impact on daily life;
- 14 and
- WHEREAS, Migraine disease affects all body systems, causing
- 16 symptoms, including severe pain, nausea, heightened sensitivity
- 17 to light, sound, smell and touch, visual disturbances, tinnitus,
- 18 chills, fatigue, difficulty finding words, known as anomic
- 19 aphasia, impaired cognitive function, numbness and weakness,
- 20 lasting for 4 to 72 hours on average; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The historical stigma and misinformation surrounding
- 22 headache diseases have impeded research and treatment
- 23 advancements, thus adequate research funding and public
- 24 education are crucial to addressing the serious and
- 25 incapacitating effects of migraine disease; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Individuals with one or more headache diseases or
- 27 comorbid medical conditions deserve equitable, affordable access
- 28 to new and innovative treatments; and
- 29 WHEREAS, The Senate is an institution that can raise
- 30 awareness for migraine and headache disorders with the general

- 1 public and the medical community; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of June 2024 as
- 3 "Migraine and Headache Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
