A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of October 2024 as "Down Syndrome 2 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Down syndrome is a genetic condition that occurs in
- 4 approximately 1 in every 640 births; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The most common form of Down syndrome, trisomy 21,
- 6 is due to an error in cell division just prior to or during
- 7 conception, with the 21st chromosome dividing in three instead
- 8 of two, resulting in 47 chromosomes per cell instead of 46; and
- 9 WHEREAS, While most data on the matter are estimates updated
- 10 from infrequently reassessed studies, the total population of
- 11 individuals living with Down syndrome in the United States is
- 12 believed to be in the hundreds of thousands; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Thanks to advances in medical treatments and
- 14 continuing research, life expectancy for individuals with Down
- 15 syndrome has increased from 10 years of age in 1960 to nearly 60
- 16 years of age today according to the most recent United States
- 17 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates; and

- 1 WHEREAS, When accounting for the increased life expectancies
- 2 and steady birth rates, while not confirmed, some reports
- 3 suggest that the total population of individuals living with
- 4 Down syndrome stands closer to the upper 300,000 figure; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Early intervention, appropriate speech, physical and
- 6 occupational therapies and quality education programs enable
- 7 individuals with Down syndrome to adapt and thrive; and
- 8 WHEREAS, With interventions, programs and the support of
- 9 family and the community, individuals with Down syndrome attend
- 10 school and participate in postsecondary opportunities, with many
- 11 going on to college, obtaining full-time employment, entering
- 12 into marriage and fully participating in their communities;
- 13 therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of October 2024
- 15 as "Down Syndrome Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 16 further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the positive
- 18 contributions of individuals with Down syndrome and their
- 19 families.
