- 4 WHEREAS, Since the beginning of law enforcement within this
- 5 Commonwealth, approximately 800 police officers have made the
- 6 ultimate sacrifice while in the line of duty, including the
- 7 following officers who died in 2013: Patrolman Daniel "J.J."
- 8 Lomax, Forest City Borough Police Department and Patrolman
- 9 William Jerry McCarthy, IV, Shenango Township Police Department;

- 11 WHEREAS, Across the United States, the week of May 11 through
- 12 17, 2014, will be recognized as National Police Week; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The first National Police Officers' Memorial Day was
- 14 held on May 15, 1982, following a proclamation signed by
- 15 President John F. Kennedy on October 1, 1962, and has continued

- 1 to be observed annually in memory of those police officers who
- 2 made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty; therefore be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Senate honor the memory of the hundreds of
- 4 police officers who have given their lives in the line of duty
- 5 in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the week of May 11
- 7 through 17, 2014, as "National Police Week" and May 5, 2014, as
- 8 "Police Officers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania.
