It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 31-18-8 of the General Laws in Chapter 31-18 entitled
"Pedestrians" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3	31-18-8. Due care by drivers Notwithstanding other provisions of this chapter or the
4	provisions of any local ordinance, every driver of a vehicle shall exercise due care to avoid
5	colliding with any pedestrian or any person propelling a human-powered vehicle upon any
6	roadway, shall give an audible signal when necessary, and shall exercise proper precaution upon
7	observing any child or any obviously confused, intoxicated, or incapacitated person. In addition,
8	the driver of a vehicle overtaking a bicycle or other human-powered vehicle must pass the bicycle
9	or other human-powered vehicle at a safe distance of not less than three feet (3') between the
10	vehicle and the human-powered vehicle. Violations of this section are subject to fines enumerated
11	in section 31-41.1-4.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
