2	WHEREAS, Global warming continues to be a threat to the environment; and
3	WHEREAS, Coal burning to produce our nation's energy adds to that threat; and
4	WHEREAS, Foreign oil cartels hold the nation hostage with price gouging; and
5	WHEREAS, Generation of alternate energy is a very high priority of the Rhode Island
6	General Assembly; and
7	WHEREAS, For more than 200 years, water power has and continues to produce clean
8	energy; and
9	WHEREAS, There are more than 600 dams in Rhode Island that continue to possess
10	power generation potential; and
11	WHEREAS, The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) regulations were set
12	as standards for giant dams such as the Grand Cooley, and prove far too costly and time
13	consuming for small and micro installations; and
