WHEREAS, The following proposed amendments to Article VII and Article VIII of the 1 2 Constitution of the state are intended to have the collective effect of simplification of the 3 redistricting process and of allowing the electors to more easily identify and evaluate candidates for the general assembly; and 4 5 WHEREAS, In order to accomplish this purpose the number of districts in the House of Representatives must be increased by one; now, therefore be it 6 7 RESOLVED, That a majority of all members elected to each house of the general assembly voting therefore, the following amendments to the Constitution of the state be proposed 8 9 to the qualified electors of the state in accordance with the provisions of Article XIV of the 10 Constitution, for their approval and the following sections are hereby amended, effective on 11 January 1, 2013, to read as follows: 12 ARTICLE VII

Section 1. Composition. -- There shall be one hundred (100) members of the house of representatives, provided, however, that commencing in 2003 there shall be seventy-five (75) members of the house of representatives and commencing in 2013 there shall be seventy-six (76) members of the house of representatives. The house of representatives shall be constituted on the basis of population and the representative districts shall be as nearly equal in population and as compact in territory as possible. The general assembly shall, after any new census taken by

authority of the United States, reapportion the representation to conform to the Constitution of the

2 state and the Constitution of the United States.

ARTICLE VIII

OF THE SENATE

Section 1. Composition. -- The senate shall consist of the lieutenant governor and fifty

(50) members from the senatorial districts in the state, provided, however, that commencing in

2003 the senate shall consist of thirty-eight (38) members from the senatorial districts in the state.

The senate shall be constituted on the basis of population and each senatorial district shall be

comprised of two (2) house districts. The general assembly shall, after any new census taken by

authority of the United States, reapportion the representation to conform to the Constitution of the

RESOLVED, That the said proposition of amendments shall be submitted to the electors for their approval or rejection at the next statewide general election. The voting places in the several cities and towns shall be kept open during the hours required by law for voting therein for general officers of the state; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the secretary of state shall cause the said proposition of amendments to be published as a part of this resolution in the newspapers of the state prior to the date of the said meetings of the said electors; and the said proposition shall be inserted in the warrants or notices to be issued previous to said meetings of the electors for the purpose of warning the town, ward, or district meetings, and said proposition shall be read by the town, ward, or district meetings to be held as aforesaid; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the town, ward, and district meetings to be held aforesaid shall be warned, and the list of voters shall be canvassed and made up, and the said town, ward, and district meetings shall be conducted in the same manner as now provided by law for the town, ward, and district meetings for the election of general officers of the state.
