HOUSE RESOLUTION

PROCLAIMING MARCH 10, 2011, TO BE "CULTURE STOPS! DAY" IN THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

1 WHEREAS, Culture Stops! Day is a citizen-driven, peaceful day of action initiated by 2 individuals and organizations in the creative sector across the United States who share the simple belief that the power of creative thought is the lifeblood of democracy; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Culture Stops! Day in Rhode Island encourages the people of this state to imagine a world where writers put down their pens and artists put down their paints. A world 5 where architects stop designing our cities, and poets, dancers, and sculptors stop teaching our 6 7 children. Where national landmarks fall into decay and where debate is no longer fostered in our 8 universities or on our radio dials. A world in which symphony halls fall silent and libraries go 9 dark and where our collective history is left unmade and unwritten; and 10 WHEREAS, On Culture Stops! Day, creative sector organizations and individuals will 11 take part in a range of planned actions, from interrupted programming and services, to shuttered 12 venues and moments of silence; and 13 WHEREAS, In Rhode Island, the non-profit industry in Providence alone generates \$111.8 million annually in economic activity and the number of employees in arts-related 14 15 businesses has increased by 11 percent between 2009 and 2010, resulting in over 13,000 people 16 employed in nearly 2,500 businesses; and 17 WHEREAS, Nationally, the non-profit arts industry alone generates \$166.2 billion

annually in economic activity, supports 5.7 million full-time equivalent jobs in the arts and

related industries, and returns \$12.6 billion in federal income taxes; and

1	WHEREAS, Both the current Congressional budget and the proposed 2012 budget call
2	for massive reductions to, and even eradication of, a range of agencies and programs, including
3	the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Humanities, Arts in
4	Education, funds for Community Development Block Grants, Pell Grants, and funding for the
5	Corporation for Public Broadcasting; and
6	WHEREAS, These actions will seriously weaken our creative sector, our country, and
7	our state economically, socially, and civically; and
8	WHEREAS, Arts and culture feed the minds and fuel the souls of Rhode Islanders and all
9	Americans; now, therefore be it
10	RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives of the State of Rhode Island and
11	Providence Plantations hereby proclaims March 10 th of 2011 to be "Culture Stops! Day," a
12	national movement launched here in Rhode Island, but championed across the nation in the states
13	of Maine, Pennsylvania, New York, Massachusetts, Texas, Virginia, and Vermont.
