## HONORING JOANNE M. GIANNINI ON RECEIVING THE DAVINCI CENTER COMMUNITY HUMANITARIAN AWARD 2011

1 WHEREAS, Our friend and former colleague, The Honorable Joanne M. Giannini, has 2 received the prestigious honor of being selected as the 2011 recipient of the DaVinci Center 3 Community Humanitarian Award. Given annually, this award is presented to persons who "give 4 unselfishly of themselves for the betterment of humanity"; and WHEREAS, Joanne Giannini is a lifelong resident of the City of Providence. She and 5 her husband, Stephen, reside in the Mt. Pleasant/Elmhurst/Valley neighborhood. She has been a 6 7 member of the Concerned Citizens of Mount Pleasant, Mount Pleasant Crime Watch, Providence 8 Crime Watch, the Elmhurst Association, the Elmhurst Clean and Green Environment Group, the 9 Friends of Elmhurst Association, and the Friends of Mt. Pleasant Library for many years; and 10 WHEREAS, Her commitment to the community eventually motivated Joanne Giannini to 11 seek and win election to the Rhode Island House of Representatives, where she passionately 12 served the people of District 7, encompassing neighborhoods in the City of Providence, for 13 sixteen years; and 14 WHEREAS, Deeply committed to equality and to bettering the lives of those less 15 fortunate and those who are not able to speak for themselves, Joanne was instrumental in enacting numerous pieces of landmark legislation, including Brendan's Law, one of the toughest child 16 abuse laws in the country, Lizzie's Law, for children's rights against an abusive parent, and 17 legislation on "Shaken Baby Syndrome" and the "Safe Haven for Children" law. She was also a 18

driving force behind legislation to end human trafficking, establish a commission to help stop

1	"Teen Violence," and close the loopholes in Rhode Island's indoor prostitution laws; and
2	WHEREAS, Held in the highest esteem by her peers and her constituency, Joanne served
3	as Chair of the House Committee on Constituent Services and the House Committee on Health,
4	Education, and Welfare. She was also the Sub-Committee Chair on General Government of the
5	House Finance Committee, and a member of the House committees on Energy and Environment,
6	as well as House Judiciary, during her tenure at the State House; and
7	WHEREAS, Joanne's civic and community involvement also includes serving as a
8	member of the Rhode Island College Foundation, the Commission on Aging, and the Rhode
9	Island Commission on Women. She was also a Board Member of Prevent Child Abuse and Past
10	Chair of the Rhode Island Caucus of Women Legislators; and
11	WHEREAS, For her service to the people of this state as a former Representative of the
12	Rhode Island General Assembly, as well as her abiding dedication to a panoply of local and
13	altruistic organizations, Joanne Giannini has earned a myriad of honors and awards. She has also
14	distinguished herself as a person worthy of this illustrious honor, as well as our utmost admiration
15	and gratitude; now, therefore be it
16	RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives of the State of Rhode Island and
17	Providence Plantations hereby recognizes and honors Joanne Giannini for many years of
18	outstanding service to our state, and for being selected by the DaVinci Center to be the 2011
19	recipient of the Community Humanitarian Award. We wish her good health, much happiness,
20	and continued success in all her future endeavors; and be it further
