# AN ACT

### RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY -- THE BREAST CANCER ACT

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 23-12.7-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 23-12.7 entitled "The 2 Breast Cancer Act" is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 23-12.7-3. Program established. 4 (a) Through funding from the Rhode Island Cancer Council, the Rhode Island department 5 of health is required to establish a program of free mammography and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screening according to American Cancer Society standards, and, where required, follow-up, 6 7 diagnostic testing, and case management for women in the state who are uninsured or underinsured. 8 (b) The screening program shall: 9 (1) Secure radiology facilities to participate in the screening program; 10 (2) Pay for screening mammograms and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings; 11 (3) Ensure that screening results are sent by mail, electronically, or otherwise, to the patient 12 in a timely manner; 13 (4) Provide diagnostic tests as required to diagnose breast cancer; 14 (5) Provide case management facilitating appropriate contact to breast surgeons, medical 15 oncologists, and radiation oncologists; and 16 (6) Provide follow-up support to women who are found to have breast cancer as a result of 17 this screening program.

(c) The director of the Rhode Island department of health is required to provide a quarterly

report to the general assembly on the program of free mammography screening, follow-up

1	diagnostic testing and case management, and public education. An advisory committee concerned
2	with advocacy, outreach, and public education shall meet on a quarterly basis and report to the
3	director.
4	SECTION 2. Section 23-12.9-2 of the General Laws in Chapter 23-12.9 entitled "Dense
5	Breast Notification and Education" is hereby amended to read as follows:
6	23-12.9-2. Public policy goals Department of health.
7	The department of health, through the Rhode Island Cancer Council, is authorized and
8	mandated to implement the following public health policy goals as they relate to dense breast
9	notification in Rhode Island. Commencing on October 1, 2014, all healthcare facilities that perform
10	mammography examinations and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings shall include in the
11	summary of the mammography report to be provided to a patient by mail, electronically, or
12	otherwise, information that identifies the patient's individual Breast Tissue Classification based on
13	the Breast Imaging Reporting and Data System established by the American College of Radiology.
14	If the facility determines that a patient has heterogeneously or extremely dense breasts, the
15	summary of the mammography report shall also include the following notice:
16	"Your mammogram indicates that you have dense breast tissue. Dense breast tissue is
17	relatively common and is found in about forty percent (40%) of women. The presence of dense
18	tissue can make it more difficult to detect cancers in the breast by mammography because it can
19	hide small abnormalities and may be associated with an increased risk. Hence, you may benefit
20	from supplementary screening tests, which may include a breast ultrasound screening, or a breast
21	MRI examination, or both, depending on your individual risk factors.
22	We are providing this information to raise your awareness of this important factor and to
23	encourage you to discuss your dense breast tissue, as well as other breast cancer risk factors, with
24	your healthcare provider. Together, you can decide which screening options are right for you.
25	A report of your results was sent to your physician. You should contact your physician if
26	you have any questions or concerns about this report."
27	SECTION 3. Section 23-17-32 of the General Laws in Chapter 23-17 entitled "Licensing
28	of Healthcare Facilities" is hereby amended to read as follows:
29	23-17-32. Mammograms Quality assurance standards. Mammograms and digital
30	breast tomosynthesis (dbt) Quality assurance standards.
31	Any licensed health care facility performing a mammogram shall meet state-approved
32	quality assurance standards for taking and processing mammograms and digital breast
33	tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings. The director of health shall have the authority to promulgate rules
34	and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

1	SECTION 4. Section 27-18-41 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-18 entitled "Accident
2	and Sickness Insurance Policies" is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	27-18-41. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated. Mammograms,
4	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
5	(a)(1) Every individual or group hospital or medical expense insurance policy or individual
6	or group hospital or medical services plan contract delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed in this
7	state shall provide coverage for mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings,
8	and pap smears, in accordance with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.
9	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, every individual or group hospital or
10	medical insurance policy or individual or group hospital or medical services plan contract
11	delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed in this state shall pay for two (2) screening mammograms
12	per year when recommended by a physician for women who have been treated for breast cancer
13	within the last five (5) years or are at high risk of developing breast cancer due to genetic
14	predisposition (BRCA gene mutation or multiple first degree relatives) or high risk lesion on prior
15	biopsy (lobular carcinoma in situ) or atypical ductal hyperplasia.
16	(b) This section shall not apply to insurance coverage providing benefits for: (1) hospital
17	confinement indemnity; (2) disability income; (3) accident only; (4) long term care; (5) Medicare
18	supplement; (6) limited benefit health; (7) specified disease indemnity; (8) sickness or bodily injury
19	or death by accident or both; and (9) other limited benefit policies.
20	SECTION 5. Section 27-19-20 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-19 entitled "Nonprofit
21	Hospital Service Corporations" is hereby amended to read as follows:
22	27-19-20. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated. Mammograms,
23	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
24	(a) Subscribers to any nonprofit hospital service plan shall be afforded coverage under the
25	plan for mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings, and pap smears, in
26	accordance with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.
27	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, subscribers to any nonprofit hospital
28	service plan shall be afforded coverage for two (2) screening mammograms per year when
29	recommended by a physician for women who have been treated for breast cancer within the last
30	five (5) years or who are at high risk of developing breast cancer due to genetic predisposition
31	(BRCA gene mutation or multiple first degree relatives) or high risk lesion on prior biopsy (lobular
32	carcinoma in situ) or atypical ductal hyperplasia.
33	SECTION 6. Section 27-20-17 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-20 entitled "Nonprofit
34	Medical Service Corporations" is hereby amended to read as follows:

1	27-20-17. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated. Mammograms,
2	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
3	(a) Subscribers to any nonprofit medical service plan shall be afforded coverage under the
4	plan for mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings, and pap smears, in
5	accordance with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.
6	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, subscribers to any nonprofit medical
7	service plan shall be afforded coverage for two (2) paid screening mammograms per year when
8	recommended by a physician for women who have been treated for breast cancer within the last
9	five (5) years or who are at high risk of developing breast cancer due to genetic predisposition
10	(BRCA gene mutation or multiple first degree relatives) or high risk lesion on prior biopsy (lobular
11	carcinoma in situ) or atypical ductal hyperplasia.
12	SECTION 7. Section 27-41-30 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-41 entitled "Health
13	Maintenance Organizations" is hereby amended to read as follows:
14	27-41-30. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated. Mammograms,
15	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
16	(a) Subscribers to any health maintenance organization plan shall be afforded coverage
17	under that plan for mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings, and pap
18	smears, in accordance with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.
19	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, subscribers to any health maintenance
20	organization plan shall be afforded coverage for two (2) paid screening mammograms per year
21	when recommended by a physician for women who have been treated for breast cancer within the
22	last five (5) years or who are at high risk of developing breast cancer due to genetic predisposition
23	(BRCA gene mutation or multiple first degree relatives) or high risk lesion on prior biopsy (lobular
24	carcinoma in situ) or atypical ductal hyperplasia.
25	SECTION 8. Section 42-62-26 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-62 entitled
26	"Catastrophic Health Insurance Plan Act" is hereby amended to read as follows:
27	42-62-26. Mammograms and Pap smears Coverage mandated. Mammograms,
28	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
29	Any insurer, as defined in this chapter, shall afford health insurance coverage for
30	mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings, and Pap smears, in accordance
31	with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.
32	SECTION 9. This act shall take effect upon passage.

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This act would amend the current law so that digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings
are available wherever mammograms are conducted and to provide insurance coverage for such
screenings.

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
