It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 34-18-16.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 34-18 entitled
- 2 "Residential Landlord and Tenant Act" is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 3 <u>34-18-16.1. Rent increases Notice requirements.</u>
- 4
  - (a) Prior to an increase in rent being imposed by a landlord for a residential tenancy,
- 5 excluding an independent living facility, assisted living facility, or congregate care facility, notice

6 of the increase shall be given in writing to any tenant by a landlord at least thirty (30) sixty (60)

7 days prior to the effective date of the increase.

- 8 (b) A landlord must of a residential tenancy, excluding an independent living facility,
- 9 assisted living facility, or congregate care facility shall give at least one hundred twenty (120) sixty

10 (60) days notice to month to month tenants over the age of sixty-two (62) years, before raising the

- 11 rent.
- 12 (c) Provided, however, that nothing in this section shall require a landlord to provide notice

13 of a rent increase on a timeframe that exceeds the timeframe set forth under any other state or

- 14 <u>federal law or regulation or requirement of any applicable housing program established under state</u>
- 15 <u>or federal law or regulation.</u>
- 16 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
