RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES AND CARRIERS -- PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 39-1-37.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 39-1 entitled "Public Utilities Commission" is hereby amended to read as follows:

39-1-37.1. Ratepayers advisory board.

- (a) There is hereby established the ratepayers advisory board. The advisory board shall consist of the following public members:
- (1) Four (4) members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, one of whom shall represent the interests of residential ratepayers; one of whom shall represent the interests of the elderly and disabled; one of whom shall represent a community-based consumer organization representing low-income individuals; and one of whom shall represent a LIHEAP consumer.
- (2) Four (4) members appointed by the senate president, one of whom shall represent the interests of residential ratepayers; one of whom shall represent a chamber of commerce; one of whom shall represent a nonprofit energy consortium of businesses; and one of whom shall represent a community action agency LIHEAP program provider.
- (3) Three (3) members appointed by the governor, one of whom shall represent the LIHEAP program administration; one of whom shall represent the interests of small business owners; and one of whom shall represent the interests of residents of affordable housing be the commissioner or the acting commissioner of the office of energy resources.
- 19 (b) The appointments to the advisory board shall be made as follows: each appointing

1	authority shall appoint one member to serve a term of one year, one member to serve a term of two
2	(2) years, and one member to serve a term of three (3) years. Thereafter, each member appointed
3	to the advisory board shall serve a three-year (3) term. The board members are eligible to succeed
4	themselves. A vacancy, other than by expiration of a term, shall be filled in the manner of the
5	original appointment, but only for the unexpired portion of the term.
6	(c) Five (5) members shall constitute a quorum. A majority vote of the board shall be
7	required for all recommendations, advice, and approvals of the board, in accordance with this
8	section.
9	(d) A board member shall not receive compensation for his or her service on the board but
10	may receive reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses, while engaged in the
11	performance of official duties of the board.
12	(e) The board shall elect annually a chairperson and vice chairperson from among its
13	membership chairperson of the board shall be the commissioner or acting commissioner of the
14	office of energy resources.
15	(f) The board shall receive staff and administrative support from the division, to organize
16	meetings and take and distribute minutes. The division shall also furnish the advisory board a
17	suitable location to hold its meetings.
18	(g) The board shall meet at least quarterly monthly and at the call of the chairperson or four
19	(4) board members. The administrator shall be present for all board meetings to inform the board
20	of the actions of the division and to respond to the board's inquiries.
21	(h) The board shall review legislative proposals and comment on existing state laws
22	relating to residential ratepayers.
23	(i) The board shall advise the administrator on matters concerning residential ratepayers
24	including, but not limited to utility shutoff policies, rate affordability, conservation measures,
25	consumer education, smart meters and/or restricted use meters, customer service charges,
26	legislation pending before the general assembly, and legislative initiatives.
27	(j) The advisory board shall issue an annual report of findings, including recommendations
28	on current or proposed state programs, policies, regulations, and laws, to the governor and the
29	general assembly.
30	(k) The board shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 2 of title 38, access to public
31	records act, and chapter 46 of title 42, open meetings act.
32	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
