Propane pricing disclosure requirements and prohibited charges. – (a) All</u> 5 propane dealers and/or suppliers shall publicly post their current propane prices, including all fees 6 7 for equipment rental, and other charges, on a company website for customer comparison or shall 8 communicate the current propane price per gallon through an e-mail, written notice, voice mail, 9 or fax, twenty-four (24) to forty-eight (48) hours before each delivery, unless said customer is 10 enrolled in a written price protection agreement. 11 (b) No propane dealer and/or supplier shall charge a customer a fee for the removal of 12 any leased propane tank or equipment. 13 (c) The current retail value of any propane remaining in a customer's tank at the time of removal of the tank shall be refunded to the customer within fourteen (14) days. 14 15 **6-37.1-2.** Enforcement of chapter. – Upon the complaint of any person, the superior court shall have jurisdiction to restrain and enjoin any act forbidden or declared illegal by any 16 17 provisions of this chapter; and it shall by the duty of the attorney general of this state to enforce
