program to include home health/homemaker care, adult day services, assisted living, and nursing

5 WHEREAS, Use of respite services by unpaid family caregivers of dependent older

adults provides a "break" from the stresses of caregiving and can delay or avoid costly nursing

WHEREAS, State funds to subsidize elder respite services for family caregivers has been

reduced while demand for such family support services has increased as the state's older

10 population grows and families strive to keep loved ones at home; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That there is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the treasury not

otherwise appropriated for the fiscal year 2019-2020, the sum of one hundred and eighty five

thousand dollars (\$185,000), in addition to the funds appropriated in fiscal year 2019-2020

budget, to the Division of Elderly Affairs in the Department of Human Services to assist family

caregivers in maintaining dependent elders at home; and the state controller is hereby authorized

and directed to draw his orders upon the general treasurer for the payment of said sum upon
