# PROCLAIMING MAY 4, 2011 AS "CHARTER PUBLIC SCHOOL DAY" IN THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

1	WHEREAS, Since the 1995 passage of Rhode Island's charter public schools' enabling
2	legislation, 15 start-up institutions have been established that serve over 3,900 students from 34
3	communities; and
4	WHEREAS, Charter public schools are independent public schools of choice that are free
5	to be innovative and are accountable for student achievement; and
6	WHEREAS, Today, Rhode Island charter public schools primarily serve urban areas and
7	face the challenges of poverty at a higher than average rate. Yet, these schools continue to be
8	among the strongest in the state; and
9	WHEREAS, Charter public schools provide an alternative public education to students
10	who desire a different learning environment than that provided by traditional public schools.
11	Charter schools provide Rhode Island parents and students their only public school choice options
12	and
13	WHEREAS, Charter public schools are designed to deliver programs tailored to
14	educational excellence and community need; and
15	WHEREAS, There is a growing unmet demand for Rhode Island charter public schools
16	as evidenced by a waiting list of over 5,000 students; and
17	WHEREAS, Because they are public schools of choice, they are open to the public,

funded by the public, and accountable to the public; now, therefore be it
