SENATE RESOLUTION

COMMEMORATING JANUARY OF 2020 AS "RHODE ISLAND SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING PREVENTION MONTH" IN THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

Referred To: Recommended for Immediate Consideration

1 WHEREAS, Human trafficking, as recognized and defined by the United Nations in the 2 "Trafficking Protocol" is the "recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or receipt of 3 persons, by means of threat or use of force or other forms of coercion, of abduction, of fraud, of 4 deception,...for the purpose of exploitation." Exploitation can include forced prostitution and 5 other forms of sexual exploitation as well as forced labor. Women and children are particularly 6 vulnerable to being exploited in these ways; and

WHEREAS, It is estimated that 25 million people are currently the victims of human
trafficking and are being used as slaves in some capacity. The International Labour Office (ILO),
estimates that human trafficking generates approximately \$150.2 billion dollars in profit; and

WHEREAS, President Donald J. Trump promulgated a number of initiatives to combat human trafficking. He proclaimed January of 2018 to be National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month. He also signed initiatives that contributed \$25 million to the Global Fund to End Modern Slavery, and provided for enhanced collaboration amongst nations and their law enforcement and other community and business organizations in order to dismantle transnational criminal organizations that are involved in human trafficking activities; now, therefore be it
