It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 23-19 of the General Laws entitled "Rhode Island Resource 1 2 Recovery Corporation" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 3 23-19-24.1. Solid waste diversion - Economic impact and strategies reporting. --(a) On or before January 1, 2018, the corporation shall submit to the governor, the senate 4 5 president and the speaker of the house, a study of the economic impact of Rhode Island recycling 6 related industries. The study shall include, but not be limited to, direct and indirect jobs created, 7 direct and indirect economic impacts, and the potential economic benefits of achieving the state's 8 fifty percent (50%) diversion goal. (b) On or before January 1, 2018, the corporation shall submit to the governor, the senate 9 10 president and the speaker of the house, a report that provides strategies to achieve the state's fifty 11 percent (50%) diversion goal, including the following: 12 (1) A review and update of the state's current diversion rate; 13 (2) Identification of problematic waste streams and sources and recommendations on handling those waste streams and sources; 14 15 (3) Evaluation of current programs and their effectiveness, and recommendations for 16 changes to those programs.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
