It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 36-9-31 of the General Laws in Chapter 36-9 entitled "Retirement
- 2 System Membership and Service Credits" is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 3

36-9-31. Armed service credit.

(a) Any active member of the retirement system, who served on active duty in the armed
service of the United States or in the Merchant Marine service of the United States as defined in
P.L. 1946, ch. 1721, § 2 may purchase credit for that service up to a maximum of four (4) years
provided that he or she has received an honorable discharge. Provided further that any employee
on an official leave of absence for illness or injury shall be eligible to purchase military credits as
defined herein while on the leave of absence.

(b) For members of the retirement system, who served in the national guard or reserves,
 who qualify as a veteran, may purchase creditable service at a ratio of five (5) years of guard or

12 reserve service to one year of creditable service, up to a maximum of four (4) years; provided that,

13 <u>he or she has received an honorable discharge. Provided further, that any employee on an official</u>

- 14 <u>leave of absence for illness or injury shall be eligible to purchase military credits as defined herein</u>
- 15 while on the leave of absence.

(b)(c) The cost to purchase these credits shall be ten percent (10%) of the member's first
 year's earnings as a state employee as defined in chapter 9 of this title, multiplied by the number of
 years and fraction thereof of the armed service or Merchant Marine service up to a maximum of

1 four (4) years.

(e)(d) There will be no interest charge provided the member makes that purchase during his or her first five (5) years of membership in the retirement system, but will be charged regular interest to date of purchase from date of enrollment into membership if purchased after completing five (5) years of membership; provided, however, any member who was in the retirement system prior to July 1, 1980, would not be charged interest whenever he or she purchases the armed services credit.

36-9-31. Armed service credit.

9 (a) Any active member of the retirement system, who served on active duty in the armed 10 service of the United States or in the Merchant Marine service of the United States as defined in 11 P.L. 1946, ch. 1721, § 2 may purchase credit for that service up to a maximum of four (4) years 12 provided that he or she has received an honorable discharge. Provided further that any employee 13 on an official leave of absence for illness or injury shall be eligible to purchase military credits as 14 defined herein while on the leave of absence.

15 (b) For members of the retirement system, who served in the national guard or reserves, 16 who qualify as a veteran, may purchase creditable service at a ratio of five (5) years of guard or 17 reserve service to one year of creditable service, up to a maximum of four (4) years; provided that, 18 he or she has received an honorable discharge. Provided further, that any employee on an official 19 leave of absence for illness or injury shall be eligible to purchase military credits, as defined herein 20 while on the leave of absence.
21 (b)(c) The cost to purchase these credits shall be ten percent (10%) of the member's first

year's earnings as a state employee as defined in chapter 9 of this title, multiplied by the number
of years and fraction thereof of the armed service or Merchant Marine service up to a maximum of
four (4) years.

25 (c)(d) There will be no interest charge provided the member makes that purchase during 26 his or her first five (5) years of membership in the retirement system, but will be charged regular 27 interest to date of purchase from date of enrollment into membership if purchased after completing 28 five (5) years of membership; provided, however, any member who was in the retirement system 29 prior to July 1, 1980, would not be charged interest whenever he or she purchases the armed 30 services credit.

31 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
