EXPRESSING DEEPEST CONDOLENCES ON THE PASSING OF THE HONORABLE GEORGE T. PANICHAS

1 WHEREAS, It is with profound sadness and regret that this Senate has learned of the 2 passing of George T. Panichas, a devoted family man, well respected former member of the 3 Rhode Island House of Representatives, and decorated veteran of World War II; and 4 WHEREAS, A loyal and hardworking man, George Panichas grew up in the City of Pawtucket. He met and married the love of his life, Angela, in 1952, and together they raised 5 their three children, Denise, Joan, and George, Jr. He had been a corporate business advisor and 6 7 realtor; and 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Panichas served our country with honor and incredible bravery during 9 World War II as an Air Force Combat Tailgunner. He completed fifty missions over enemy occupied Europe, a feat that very few men had the courage to endure and only few survived; and 10 WHEREAS, On November 3^d of 1970, Mr. Panichas was elected to the Rhode Island 11 12 House of Representatives where he staunchly served the people of Pawtucket for fourteen years. 13 He served on the House Committee on Finance, and was notably the first Greek-American 14 elected state official in the history of Rhode Island; and 15 WHEREAS, Mr. Panichas was actively involved in community affairs throughout his 16 lifetime. He was devoted to his faith and a member of the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church. He was also a member of the American Legion, V.F.W., Pawtucket Board of Realtors, National 17 Board of Realtors, 401st Bomb Group Association, Turks Head Club, Order of A.H.E.P.A., 18

1	State Committeeman, and the Democratic Party Executive Committee; and
2	WHEREAS, A member of the Rhode Island Veterans' Advisory Board and Veterans'
3	Cemetery in Exeter, Rhode Island, where the "George Panichas Administration Building" was
4	named in his honor, Mr. Panichas was also a member of the Governor's Advisory Committee on
5	Veterans' Affairs, and served as the Chairperson of the Oversight Subcommittee for the Veterans'
6	Cemetery; and
7	WHEREAS, Our thoughts and hearts hold great empathy and sorrow for the family of
8	The Honorable George Panichas. In addition to his wife of fifty-seven years and his children, Mr.
9	Panichas was the loving grandfather of four beautiful grandchildren, Angela, Michael, George III,
10	and Melina. He was also a great father-in-law to Mathew and Sia; and
11	WHEREAS, The Honorable George Panichas was blessed with the love of his family, the
12	loyalty of his friends, and the respect of his community. He enriched the lives of all who knew
13	him and will be dearly missed; now, therefore be it
14	RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations
15	hereby expresses its deepest sympathies to the entire Panichas Family on the passing of The
16	Honorable George Panichas. He will forever be remembered by this Senate and the people of
17	Rhode Island for his commitment to the citizens of our Ocean State; and be it further
